## WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 1995

1. The RNA Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Act and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the RNA holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the Showgrounds.
2. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, RNA staff, show visitors and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
3. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
4. Exhibits will only be held and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor.
5. A **"No Smoking Policy"** will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly **prohibited** in the horse stalls or pavilions.
6. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is **prohibited** and all power boards must be tested and tagged.
7. All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect.  
This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.  
Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Brisbane Exhibition.

## ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

The attention of exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject of the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule.

Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Entries Department.

Judging of Exhibits in the various sections will take place as above. Exhibits must be in position and ready for judging not later than the times stated.

Copies of all results will be made available to exhibitors as soon as possible after the completion of Judging.

Effective Arrangement Judging results will be withheld until after the prize awards have been announced.

Exhibitors may object to points and such objection to be in the hands of the Honorary Council Stewards within 30 minutes of the results being delivered to the courts, except for Effective Arrangements.

# DISTRICT EXHIBITS

## COMPETITION IN PRIMARY PRODUCTS

### SPECIAL REGULATION

Subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971 and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association the following Special-General Regulations shall apply to District Exhibits.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRICT EXHIBIT COMPETITION

1. The Association's By-Laws, with these Regulations, will govern this Competition.

The amount is to be divided in proportion to the total points awarded to the respective competitors provided that if there is one competitor the amount specified will be paid. Any collection securing less than 1500 points will not be entitled to an award under this Regulation.

2. The sum of \$11,400 for organising expenses, including individual travel/allowances (in addition to the Prize Money) will be paid to each competing District obtaining not less than 1500 points. In the event of a District receiving Organising Allowance failing to compete, the Organising Allowance must be returned to the Royal National Association. Organising Allowances will be available on application after 25 May 2011.

3. All exhibits from each district are to be sent to the Exhibition in ONE LOT if possible to keep the cost of the road transport to a minimum. Competing Districts will be reimbursed the cost of road freight to the Exhibition.

Claims for the cost of transport must be accompanied by an invoice or receipt from the carrier concerned.

All claims for expenses must be accompanied by supporting documentation (receipts/invoices) and be in the hands of the RNA Competitions Officer by 29 October of the year they related to. No payments can be made after that date.

All exhibits are to be certified by the Secretary or Organiser of the sending District as belonging to that District's display.

4. Each collection must be in the charge of a responsible member or nominee of the Society exhibiting same, who will have to arrange and display the exhibit to the best advantage.

5. The Association will erect all stands required in the Courts for the display of the Sections of the exhibits. The size of the Courts shall be as follows:

Frontage 10.3m, Depth 9.0m, Height - No Part of the display to extend above the line drawn under the roof trusses. Only Name of court permitted above the trusses. Nothing to hang from trusses. Plans may be obtained from the Association on application.

**The Organisers MUST send plans of the exhibits and/or requests for timber to the Entries Department of the Royal National Association by 30 May preceding the Show.**

THE COURTS WILL BE ERECTED BY THE ASSOCIATION ON RNA STANDARD BASE DESIGN AND MAY BE DECORATED BY EXHIBITS WITH PASTORAL OR AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS OF THE DISTRICT, WHICH PRODUCTS MUST COME WITHIN THE SCALE OF POINTS FOR COMPETITION, EXHIBITS USED FOR DECORATIONS SHALL NOT BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION BY THE JUDGE IN AWARDING SECTION POINTS BUT POINTS WILL BE ALLOCATED UNDER THE HEADING OF ATTRACTIVENESS OF GENERAL DECORATIONS.

The Association's carpenters will NOT be available after 4.00pm on the Friday prior to the Showing opening.

No court is permitted to have their tables or produce expand past a line 2.2 metres east of the white picket fence, to the fire hose on the District Office wall after 6.30pm on the Sunday preceding the Show commencing.

6. All collections of exhibits must be the BONA FIDE PRODUCTION OF THE DISTRICT BY WHICH IT IS EXHIBITED, and must not include produce or products from any State Institution, including Technical Colleges. Produce to be shown by a district must be capable of being produced in that district and is generally available there. However it does not have to be a commercial product of the district. Produce must have been raised during the current season or during the immediate preceding season. EXHIBITS OF WOOL AND SEED COTTON ARE TO BE LABELLED. A TICKET IS TO BE DISPLAYED ON SUCH SAMPLE OF WOOL AND SEED COTTON, SHOWING THE DISTRICT WHERE GROWN.

The Judge shall satisfy himself that the product judged is produced in that district.

7. Collections may consist of all or any of the Articles mentioned in the Scale of Points hereinafter set out. No exhibits other than those enumerated in the scale of points shall be included in the collection. The Council Stewards have the right to reject any portion of a collection which they consider does not come within the intended scope of the competition.

8. **WOODS** - All woods are to be timber species of importance, produced in the district.

Each Sample is to be clearly identified with its standard trade name and botanical name, or preceding names. The names are to be referenced from the 'Woods in Australia' by Keith R Bootle (2<sup>nd</sup> edition published by McGraw Hill 2004).

Individual samples may be of any size and shape (eg. rectangular, triangular, elliptical, etc.) provided the minimum specified dimensions are adhered to at one point along the length, width and thickness of the sample. This provision allows exhibitors through originality to improve the effective arrangement of the whole exhibit.

The samples to be judged must be displayed in two groups as listed in the scale of points and individual samples must be capable of easy removal for examination by the judges.

The display groups are (1) Sawn Hardwoods and (2) Sawn Furniture and Joinery Woods. One sample from each of the two groups is to be changed each year. Group (2) is to include three softwoods.

The following definitions apply:

Hardwood = Angiosperm (Broad leaf flowering plant)  
Softwood = Gymnosperm (Conifer and cone bearing plant).

9. All exhibits must be in accordance with the quantities or dimensions specified. Any single exhibit containing less than the specified amount may be disqualified. The judge will take into consideration when judging the vegetable and green fodder that those forming part of exhibits derived from the more remote areas may have suffered in appearance by reason of long transport. Note: An identifiable amount of the item exhibited must be displayed.

10. All agricultural and forestry products must be correctly identified for judging using tickets supplied by the RNA. No points shall be awarded to products for ticketing.

11. All judges will be introduced to the organiser of each exhibit before commencing judging. If the judges so desire they may ask questions of or seek explanations from the organiser before commencing judging. When the judges commence their duties, no District will be allowed to arrange or add to their exhibits without permission. Judging shall not commence until after the delegate in charge of the exhibit has been notified.
12. No exhibitor or person representing a district shall address any Judge while the latter is judging. All explanations must be supplied to the Stewards in every case. No Steward shall consult with the Judge or offer any advice or suggestion in respect to the number of points to be allotted in any case. During judging, no person shall be admitted to the courts except the Judges, Stewards and delegate or delegates appointed by the district to explain any details which may be considered necessary by the Stewards.
13. A Judge may seek from the Honorary Council Steward, any ruling or interpretation of the conditions required.
14. When the judges consider that any exhibit or any portion thereof does not possess sufficient merit and is not produced in the district exhibiting, they shall have full power to exclude the same from the points awarded.
15. The Council Stewards shall furnish such expert assistance as they think necessary.
16. Judges will be requested to return to the courts at the conclusion of their judging for the purpose of discussing with district officials the merits and/or demerits of the court.
17. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.
18. All items entered for judging must be represented on the exhibit floor by a representative quantity of such items.
19. For the purpose of this Competition the State of Queensland is normally divided into five districts as set out hereunder. Exhibits from districts in other States are eligible to compete on boundaries as defined by the Council.

#### SCALE OF POINTS IN THE JUDGING OF EXHIBITS

Each District Committee may, subject to the approval of the Society, eliminate from the scale of judging points any section or sub-section of Sections 1 – 10. The total judging points for all items eliminated shall not exceed 360.

The whole or any portion of Sections 1 – 10 may be included in the eliminations. A list of all items to be eliminated must be given to the Honorary Council Steward a minimum of 1 hour prior to the judging of the section or sub-section.

In consequence of this provision the competition shall be decided upon the highest percentage of points gained by the commodities exhibited in the respective Courts.

### ELIGIBILITY

2. Open to youth groups, church youth groups, or schools or colleges in Queensland. Exhibits must be designed and constructed by 13-25 year olds. Adults assistance may be provided with the design of exhibit and construction of the back wall only. All construction on the exhibit floor (unless done by RNA carpenters) and all produce on display must be placed on the exhibit by the youth members.
3. Written Nominations for entries will close with the Entries Department of the Royal National Association on Friday 22 April 2011.

### PRIZE MONEY

4. To be divided in proportion to the number of points awarded to each exhibit by the Judges, except in the case of only one competitor, when the amount specified will be paid.

### ALLOWANCE

5. Upon written application to the Entries Department Royal National Association, a sum of money for organizing and expense purposes, including meals, will be paid to each competing exhibit in addition to prize money.

This will be assessed on a one-way road distance from Brisbane to the place or town where the group exhibiting has its regular meetings. Allowances are calculated as follows:-

Up to 80 km	\$1000
Over 80 km up to 240 km	\$1115

Groups over 240 kms from Brisbane should contact the Honorary Council Steward who will liaise with the RNA about special arrangements.

### WITHDRAWAL

9. Entries in the competition shall be limited to six in number or otherwise determined by the RNA Councillor.

### ON-SITE ACCOMMODATION

10. The Royal National Association Show Camp building will be available for accommodation for the weekend and three week days prior to judging and written application for this accommodation is to be made to The Entries Dept, Locked Bag 1010, Albion, Qld 4010 prior to Friday 18 June 2011.

All endeavours will be made to accommodate schools, however due to limited space, we cannot guarantee all requests will be successful. It is recommended alternative arrangements are in place.

11. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.
12. No vehicle larger than a Ford Falcon Wagon (5.3 metres in length) will be permitted to park in the Agriculture Hall for a period greater than 30 minutes. Compliance with this and other schedule regulations prior to commencement of judging is worth 50 points.

The RNA reserves the right to return plans to exhibitors for alteration if those plans are deemed by the Ground Superintendent/carpenters to be too expensive or complex to build. It is not expected that any display will take longer than one day to construct.

The placing and preparation of all produce on the exhibit must be done by the youth members.

2. Plans of the allotted space are available on application. The Group Organiser must forward plans of the exhibit to:

by Monday 20 May 2011. The Royal National Association will arrange for the completion of the stand in accordance with the plan submitted.

Plans should give full details of all construction required and upon receipt the Association will proceed to erect stands according to these plans. Any requests for 3 phase power must be submitted by Monday 20 May 2011

The RNA will not be responsible for any further alterations or additions to the stand after they have been erected, and such alterations and additions must be carried out by the Groups concerned, at their own expense.

An inspection of the stand may be made by the Youth Group Organiser, when advised that the work has been completed.

RNA tradesmen will not be available after the exhibit has been completed and inspected. Groups are requested to keep the same basic design for a period of at least 2 years. Minor modifications will be permitted.

3. Details relative to lighting and power points are to be shown on the plan when submitted. Each group will be permitted a maximum of two overhead (porta flood style only) spotlights. Once installed the RNA will not be responsible for the supply of additional lighting or power requirements, and additions or alterations to lighting or power will not be made without prior consent of the RNA Electricians. All such work must be carried out by a fully qualified electrician.

## DIMENSIONS

- Dimensions of exhibits shall be as shown on the official blueprint. The back wall of the exhibit must not be over 4.25m in height, 4.8m if the back wall includes the Group name at the top. Signs bearing the Group name can be supplied by Groups or by the RNA on receipt of a written request.
- Groups are not permitted to have sound as part of their exhibit.
- RNA tables will not be available to groups – please bring your own.

## CONSTRUCTION TIME

- Groups can commence construction of their exhibits after 8.30am Saturday 30 July 2011.
- All fences must remain within the boundaries of the group's display – 2.0 metres west from front of exhibit.
- All fences to be returned to original position and area left clean and tidy by 10.00pm the night before the Show opens.

## TICKETING

- All ticketing, labelling or wording of any kind on the Exhibit should be large enough to be clearly readable at a distance of 5 metres.
- Each individual item need not be labelled as such, but points will be allotted for intelligent use of captions, labels and signs to indicate the connection between produce displayed and the actual theme of the Exhibit.
- Where an item cannot be readily identified by a Judge, ie. timbers, cakes, jams, jellies, etc. a small label at the base is sufficient.
- Unusual items not easily identifiable, as well as grains and fodders, etc should be labelled if possible for the convenience of the public.  
Ticketing need not be the work of Group Members.

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- Passes will be provided for Entry to the Showgrounds for members engaged in the erection or dismantling of exhibits or for any other purpose in connection with exhibits between 8.00am Thursday 11 August and 9.00pm Saturday 20 August inclusive. Admission will be made only on presentation of these passes.
- Dismantling of the exhibits shall not begin before Saturday 20 August, with the exception of highly perishable items which shall be removed as and when necessary by the Stewards.
- Groups are required to maintain the standard of exhibits during the period of the Exhibition and where necessary to replace perishable items with similar items of reasonable quality ie perishable produce must be placed on the stand where it can be replaced easily. Quality of produce must be such that it will last for the duration of the show.

## SELLING TIME

- 1.45pm – 4.00pm Saturday 20 August 2011 according to Show crowds and/or weather conditions as advised by the RNA Councillor.
- Groups are not permitted to display sponsors signs.
- Groups are requested to provide continuous supervision of exhibits from 10.00am to 4.00pm daily on weekends and public holidays. Competing groups may share this responsibility.
- Commercially available citrus wax is the only form of polish/spray permitted to be used on produce for sale at the conclusion of the show.

## SCALE OF POINTS USED IN THE JUDGING OF EXHIBITS

### SECTION 1

- Public Appeal Points will be awarded for use of lighting, design, colour, movement and any other similar features so arranged and used to attract or appeal to the public.  
**Maximum 50 points**
- Display  
Effectiveness of portrayal of central theme and design of the exhibit floor and wall area. Points to include use made for display of all items on the exhibit.  
**Maximum 50 points**
- Effective Use of Products  
Diversity, quality of displayed, how arranged, quantity of items, inclusive of other items, not submitted for judging only.  
**Maximum 50 points**
- General Finish and Neatness  
Judges will consider the overall standard of finish and representation throughout the exhibit, with particular reference to the presentation of primary produce, and including printing and lettering on display. **ALL Grains on the floor of the exhibit must be presented in its natural state. Points will be discounted for failure to comply.** Washing and cleaning of naturally dirty products e.g. pumpkins, melons etc is acceptable.  
**Maximum 50 points**
- Compliance with construction and other schedule regulations prior to judging.
  - Correct and current tagging of all electrical appliances  
**5 points**
  - Compliance with all regulations in the schedule  
**5 points**
  - Plans/requests submitted by deadlines  
**10 points**
  - Work and materials are to be kept in own designated areas at all times  
**10 points**
  - Safe working conditions maintained during set up period  
**10 points**
  - Fences to be returned to their correct places and the display area is clear of all rubbish and left tidy by 10.00pm on Wednesday 4 August  
**10 points****Maximum 50 points**  
**Total Maximum (Section 1) 250 points**
- NOTE:** Judges of this section also allocate marks for Commercial Timbers in Section 2. Sub section (viii) (f). As per schedule, 16 marks are allocated which are added to other points awarded for Timber judging.

## SECTION 2

Includes (i) Grains; (ii) Fodders; (iii) Fresh Fruits; (iv) Culinary Arts; (v) Vegetables; (vi) Other Agricultural Produce; (vii) Improved Pasture Grasses or Legumes; (viii) Commercial Timbers; (ix) Other Produce. SEVEN shall be nominated for judging of quality. Details of the Sub-sections nominated for judging must be received in writing not later than Thursday 15 July 2011. A maximum of 60 points may be obtained for each Sub-Section so nominated.

**Total Maximum (Section 2) 420 points**

**Aggregate Maximum 670 points**

The following conditions for judging of quality apply to the ten Sub-Sections in Section 2. (Larger quantities of any item in these Sub-Sections may be exhibited for display purposes. The quantities stipulated below refer to items for judging of quality only.)

**NB.** Where sheaves, grain, hay and other produce cannot be conveniently inspected by the Judge a sufficient portion of each exhibit must be set aside in a position where it can be readily examined. Minimum sample portions are as follows;

Grains	2 kg
Fruit	4 kg
Root Crops	3 kg
Any other Veges	3 kg
Nuts	500gm + 100 (no shell)
Fibre	1 kg
Other Products	1 kg
Oil Seed	1 kg

Any exhibit failing to meet the minimum sample requirements for any sub-section will not be awarded points in that category.

### Sub-Section (i) GRAINS (Maximum points 60)

At least 3kg of each of any four of the following: Wheat, oats, barley, sorghum, triticale, maize, canary, white French millet, grey striped sunflower and red panicum (15 points for each type). Any grain on the back wall or as seeded arrangements are not included as part of the 3kg of grain specified for judging. Seeds treated with seed dressing or coatings are **not** eligible for entry. All seeds should be free of any chemicals with the exception of weevil fumigant. The display of grain for judging on exhibit floor must be all grain and not topped.

No coating of seeds, with sprays e.g.: varnish/lacquer/oil etc are allowed. Marks will be deducted in this section if this occurs.

### Sub-Section (ii) FODDERS (Maximum Points 60)

One sample from each of groups A, B and C.

Your requirements for this section are:

- HAY (20 points) half a bale of minimum dimensions 430mm x 480mm x 340mm.
- CHAFF (20 points) minimum of 18 litres (a full tomato box or 2 x 9 litre buckets)
- Must choose either (i) or (ii), NOT a combination of both (20 points)

(i) **RAW HAMMERMILL PRODUCTS** (3 kgs each or a total of 9kg if in combination) to be comprised of any THREE grains either SEPERATELY or in COMBINATION displayed in EITHER the fine OR the course state. These do not include chicken starter, laying mash/pellets or any commercially manufactured feed that has additional vitamins, supplements or minerals added.

**OR**

(ii) **STOCKMEAL PRODUCTS** (3kg each). To be comprised of any three stockmeal products. Stockmeals in pelleted form are not acceptable.

Raw Hammermill/Stockmeal products must be labelled for judging showing clearly the type of grain or fodder used – particularly in the case of mixtures. Labels must also indicate the purpose for which the product is intended (eg. Horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, poultry, goats, camels etc.)

### Sub-Section (iii) FRESH FRUITS (Maximum points 60)

Not less than 12kg of one of the Sub-Sections (a), (b), (c), (d) – (20 points for each variety), or (e).

- Stone and/or Pome Fruit - three varieties.
- Citrus - three varieties.
- Tropical Fruit - three varieties.
- Any other fruits - three varieties (Rockmelons, Honeydew melons, berries, avocados etc.) or
- One variety (3kg) from EACH of sub sections (a), (b), (c) and (d). 15 points each subsection.

Quality of produce must be such that it will last for the duration of the Show.

### Sub-Section (iv) CULINARY ARTS (Maximum points 60)

Five of the following (12 points for each type)  
No commercially produced products are to be entered for judging.

- Decorated Cake – one 20cm (8 inch) cake eg Birthday, Anniversary, Christmas.
- Plain Scones – 7 to be exhibited.
- Muffins – 6 to be exhibited.
- Homemade Chocolates – 10 plain or filled.
- Homemade Biscuits – 3 varieties – 4 of each variety.
- Boiled Fruit Cake – 20cm (8 inch) cake  
All to be cut by judge with the exception of the decorated cake.
- Jams - Two 500g bottles (2 distinct varieties required, one bottle of each)
- Marmalades - two 500g bottles (2 distinct varieties required, one bottle of each)
- Sauces - two 300ml bottles (2 distinct varieties required, one bottle of each)
- Chutneys - two 500g bottles (2 distinct varieties required, one bottle of each)
- Pickles - two 500g bottles (2 distinct varieties required, one bottle of each)

All items to be correctly named with small labels to allow identification by the Judge. Jams, jellies, marmalades, sauces, chutneys and pickles should be exhibited in sealed jars and will be opened by the Judge.

### Sub-Section (v) VEGETABLES (Maximum points 60)

Any two types from EACH of Sub-Section (a), (b) and (c).

- Pumpkins - two samples of any two of the following pumpkins – Jarrahdale, Qld Blue, Ken's Special, Butternut or Sweet Grey, plus an additional one of each type displayed as a sample for cutting by the judges. (A total of 6 pumpkins is required). 20 points.
- Root Crops (beetroot, potatoes, onions etc.) 6 kg of each type. 20 points
- Any other vegetable (tomatoes etc) 6 kg of each type 20 points

### Sub-Section (vi) AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (Maximum points 60)

Not eligible for entry elsewhere. At least 10 items, with a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 3 from any of the subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d). (6 points each). A minimum of 1kg per item excluding cotton 500 gram sample required.

- Nuts 2 types only (peanuts, macadamia nuts etc) must be exhibited in the raw state mainly with shell on and a small sample of nuts (100grams) of each type displayed without shells.
- Fibres - any natural plant or animal fibre in the raw/unprocessed state. (raw cotton, sisal, hemp, flax, kenaf, greasy wool, mohair, cashmere, alpaca etc.)
- Other products (including, Green Ginger, Coffee Beans, Navy Beans and other pulse crops etc.)

- (d) Oil Seeds (Safflower, Black Sunflower, Soybean, Canola, Linseed, Linola, Sesame etc.)

Groups must supply Honorary Council Stewards with a list of items to be judged by 8.00pm on Monday 8 August 2011.

**Sub-Section (vii) IMPROVED WINTER PASTURE GRASS AND WINTER LEGUMES**

(Maximum 60 points)

- (a) Three different types of Winter Improved Pasture Grass (eg Rye grasses,) - in green condition - either in pots or freshly dug plot. Minimum area of plot or pot 225 sq cm (10 points each).
- (b) Three different types of Winter Improved Pasture Legumes displayed in natural green condition – (eg Clover, Lucerne and Medics) either in pots of freshly dug plot. Minimum area of plot or pot 225 sq cm (10 points each.)

To be judged on value of samples as commercial pastures. All types may be displayed growing individually, or as a mixture. Pastures displayed to be suited to district entering exhibit.

**Sub-Section (viii) COMMERCIAL TIMBERS**

(Maximum points 60)

Groups must display the items and quantities specified in sections (a) (b) (c) (d) (e) and (f).

- (a) 4 varieties of Hardwoods 1 point for each true sample and 2 points for presentation of each sample and 1 point for naming each sample correctly. (16 points)
- (b) 3 varieties of Softwoods. Only pine varieties are softwoods. No other timber can be entered as a softwood. 1 point for each true sample and 2 points for presentation of each sample and 1 point for naming each sample correctly. (12points)
- (c) 2 plantation timber varieties (not a pine) or 2 cabinet timbers from this list (Queensland Maple, Silky Oak, Black Bean, Red Cedar or Silver Ash) or 1 plantation timber and 1 cabinet timber from above list. 1 point for true sample and 2 points for presentation, and 1 point for naming each correctly. Minimum sizes of all timber samples to be not less than 250mm long x 90mm wide x 12mm thick. All timber samples from Section A, B and C to be displayed in both the dressed and polished states. (8 points)
- (d) One manufactured article of hardwood from one of the varieties displayed (4 points).
- (e) One manufactured article of softwood from one of the varieties displayed (4 points).
- (f) Presentation of timber samples as a part of the exhibit to make an effective display (16 points).

**NOTE:** Timber samples must be clearly and accurately labelled for judging showing standard trade name and botanical name **or** preceding name.

Sections (a) to (e) judged by Timber Judge on the Monday.

Section (f) judged by the Effective Arrangement Judge on the Thursday.

One hardwood and one softwood are to be changed each year. Timbers, not eligible for display in (a) (b) or (c) may be used to enhance the exhibit in section (f).

**Sub-Section (ix) OTHER PRODUCE**

(Maximum points 60)

(a) **DAIRY PRODUCTS**

(20 points)

Dummy or blank samples must be used on the display for milks, dairy desserts, yoghurts and cheeses. A duplicate of the displayed "blanks" must be presented for judging.

- (1) Milks: At least 600ml from any two of the following, Fat reduced milks, calcium enriched milks, skim milk, or flavoured milk. (2 points each – maximum of 4 points).
- (2) Queensland made cheeses: May be boutique or speciality cheeses. A minimum of 170 grams of any 4 different cheeses (Maximum of 10 points)
- (3) Any 3, with a maximum of 2 of any one of the following - dairy desserts/yoghurts/custards in a commercial container, minimum size 170gms each. (2 points for each sample maximum of 6 points)

(b) **POULTRY PRODUCTS**

(20 points)

One item from any two of the following groups (a), (b) or (c) (10 points each):

- (a) Standard Hen Eggs (1 dozen brown/off brown/dark)  
(b) Standard Hen Eggs (1 dozen white/off white/light)  
(c) One dozen from any other variety (duck, bantam etc)  
All hen eggs to be a minimum of 55gr but not more than 61gr in mass. One egg of each type to be broken by Judge for examination.

(c) **APIARY PRODUCTS**

(20 points)

At least 500g of each of the following (4 points each):- Light honey, dark honey, block of white wax, block of yellow wax (in the case of wax two of the same may be exhibited). Moulded wax may be used for display purposes only. Honey must be shown in the Standard Trade Jar approved by the Queensland Beekeepers Association. The jar is round (not panelled) and of clear glass with white screw top. It measures approximately: Height 120mm with cap diameter 62mm and contains 500g reputed nett weight of honey. To expedite judging, jars should be filled to capacity. AN AIR SPACE OF 6mm TO BE LEFT AT THE TOP OF JAR.

(d) **OTHER ANIMAL PRODUCTS**

(not eligible for entry elsewhere) (20 points)

- (i) Hams – One tin of Leg Ham approx 400g (8 points).
- (ii) Cured Meats –
- (a) Salamis, Mettwursts or Wursts – each of any 2 of these with total weight of 500gms (8 points)
- OR
- (b) Cabanossi, Kabana – total weight of 500 gms (8 points).
- (iii) Tinned Meats, (excluding Leg Ham). Any other tinned meats approx 200g tins (camp pie, spam, corned meat, tongue etc). Minimum 1kg total weight. 4 points

# YOUTH FRUIT AND VEGETABLES COMPETITION

1. The By-Laws with these Regulations will govern the competition.

## ELIGIBILITY

2. Open to youth groups, church youth groups, or schools or colleges. Exhibits must be designed and constructed by 13 - 25 year olds. Adult assistance may be provided with the design of exhibit and construction of the back wall only. All construction on the exhibit floor (unless done by RNA carpenters) and all produce on display must be placed on the exhibit by the youth members.

## PRIZE MONEY

3. If only one competitor \$230; if two \$460; if three \$690; if four \$920; if five \$1150; if six \$1380; if seven \$1610 to be divided in proportion to the number of points awarded to each exhibit by the Judges except in the case of only one competitor when the amount specified will be paid.

## ALLOWANCE

4. The sum of \$1600 for organizing and expense purposes, including meals, (in addition to Prize Money) will be paid to each competing group. At the discretion of the Council Steward and upon written application to the Entries Department, early payment of the organizing allowance may be made to any competing group if required to complete their display.

In the event of a group failing to compete, any allowance if paid, must be returned to the Royal National Association by the first day of the Exhibition. Any group which is in excess of 160 kilometres of Brisbane will be paid an additional \$200 as a travelling allowance. Allowances not paid to groups prior to the commencement of the Show will be paid with the prize money.

## ON-SITE ACCOMMODATION

5. The Royal National Association Show Camp building will be available for accommodation for the weekend and three week days prior to judging and written application for this accommodation is to be made to The Entries Dept, Locked Bag 1010, Albion, Qld 4010 prior to Friday 17 June 2011. All endeavours will be made to accommodate schools, however due to limited space we cannot guarantee all requests will be successful. It is recommended alternative arrangements are in place.
6. All entrants must display in their exhibit and remain there for the Show at least four containers (trays, boxes, cartons etc) of fruit and vegetables. These shall be packed as a standard pack in a recognised manner and container as approved by the Standards branch, DPIF.
7. These will form part of the points allocated in part A.
8. The Organiser of each exhibit shall be a group member. Fruit and/or vegetables may be drawn from any district.
9. The back wall of the exhibit will consist of up to 33% non fruit. This will give competitors a range of additional materials which they can use to display their theme. (eg grains, natural fibres, tree bark, paint, wrapped fruit etc.) 85% of the exhibit floor area must be comprised of fruit and or vegetables and of this area no more than 10% can be nuts.
10. Groups are not permitted to display signs recognizing Sponsors.
11. A maximum of two overhead (porta flood style etc) spotlights will be permitted for each group.
12. The Council Stewards may furnish such expert assistance as they think necessary.

13. Written Nominations for entries will close with the Entries Department of the Royal National Association on Friday 22 April.
14. Entries in the competition shall be limited to seven in number or otherwise determined by RNA Councillors.
15. Groups are not permitted to have sound as part of their exhibit.
16. Exhibitors in the Youth Exhibitors Competition are not permitted to use spray paints/spray cans in the Agricultural Hall at any time.
17. No vehicle larger than a Ford Falcon Wagon (5.3 metres in length) will be permitted to park in the Agriculture Hall for a period greater than 30 minutes. All such vehicles may enter the Hall to unload but then must find alternative parking elsewhere after 1.00pm on the Tuesday preceding the Show opening.

## CONSTRUCTION
