IMPORTANT NOTICE ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

Introduction of Accommodation Fee - Please read section conditions carefully.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the following extracts from the By-Laws

DISEASE OR DANGER

- 58 Should there be any reason to suspect that any Exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, or objectionable, the Council through its Officials, reserves the rights of removing the same from or refusing its admittance to the Royal Queensland Show.
- 59 An Exhibitor who detects or suspects any illness amongst any of his entries whilst the animals are at the Showgrounds must:
- (a) Report this fact immediately to the Superintendent responsible for that particular section;
 - (b) Ensure that the animal/s is/are contained within its/their accommodation area/s unless advised otherwise by the Superintendent or the Association's Veterinary Surgeon; and
 - (c) Where feasible to do so, contain soiled bedding from the animal/s within its/their accommodation area.
- 60 Council may at its discretion require to have any biological tests carried out on any animal exhibited at the Royal Queensland Show or to have materials collected from such animals in order to have tests carried out, after such animals arrive at the Showgrounds.
- 61 If in the opinion of a Council Steward of a Section, an Exhibit in such Section requires Veterinary treatment then if the Exhibitor cannot be contacted immediately, the Council Stewards may instruct a Veterinary Surgeon to treat such Exhibit and the costs of such Veterinary Surgeon shall be paid by the Exhibitor to the Association. The Association shall not be in any way liable to an Exhibitor for any damage to or injury to such Exhibit.
- 62 Where, in the opinion of the Association, an Exhibit, being an animal, should be destroyed or removed from the Showgrounds, the Association's Veterinary Surgeon or the Association may destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Alternatively, the Association may require the Exhibitor to destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Any costs incurred by the Association pursuant to this By-Law must be reimbursed by the Exhibitor.
- 63 The Association shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection howsoever arising.

PRIZE AWARDS

- 76 The Prize Ribbons, affixed to Exhibits, shall be distinguished by the following colours, viz:-
- Grand Champion - Red, White and Blue
 - Champion - Purple
 - Reserve Champion - Dark Green
 - First - Blue
 - Second - Red
 - Third - White
 - Fourth - Yellow
 - Fifth - Light Green
 - Sixth - Brown
 - Seventh - Buff
 - Eighth - Pink
 - Ninth - Orange
 - Tenth - Grey
 - Special Prizes - Pale Blue
- 77 For Group Classes - Pink and Blue, Pink and Red, Pink and White, Pink and Yellow, for First, Second, Third and Fourth respectively. Ribbons will only be attached to Exhibits in the Horse, Cattle, Sheep, Pig, Goat and Dog Sections.

UNETHICAL CONDUCT

- 105 The Exhibitor, the Owner or any person in charge of an animate Exhibit shall not engage in unethical conduct. The Exhibitor, the Owner and any person in charge of an animal to which unethical conduct relates are deemed to have acted in breach of this By-Law, whether or not having been knowingly concerned in the unethical conduct. The Council or relevant Sectional Committee shall decide whether or not any conduct constitutes unethical conduct but without in any way restricting the meaning of that expression, unethical conduct may include the presentation as an Exhibit for judging:
- (a) of an animal other than in its natural conformation after normal feeding and grooming, except as otherwise provided either expressly or by necessary implication in the regulation or in the definition of a class in which the animal is entered;
 - (b) of any animal having undergone any operation or procedure materially altering the structure or natural conformation of any part of its body, whether by the introduction of any substance or thing subcutaneously, or by any surgery, or by the administration of any substance or chemical or by the attachment of any object or thing;
 - (c) of an animal having undergone any operation or procedure that changes by exaggeration, minimisation or otherwise in natural conformation or physical constitution or appearance;
 - (d) of an inanimate object, that is created, constituted, formed or includes goods, substances or things not normally found in objects of like nature;
 - (e) that is not the animal or the object or thing entered for the Class to be judged;
 - (f) in breach of the Regulation.
- 106 An Exhibitor, or person in charge, of an animate Exhibit must:
- (a) use all reasonable steps to ensure that the Exhibit is housed and cared for in accordance with the Association's current animal welfare policy;
 - (b) obey any direction from a member of the Association's Council, or from any other official of the Association, relating to the care and welfare of that or any other Exhibit;
 - (c) if called upon to do so, surrender the Exhibit to the Association, in circumstances where in the reasonable opinion of the Association's Veterinarian, the Exhibit is in need of urgent veterinary attention.
- 107 An Exhibitor must not use, or have in his possession, any electric or electronic apparatus or any improper contrivance capable of affecting the performance of an Exhibit.

EXHIBIT UNWORTHY OF AWARD

- 108 An Exhibit shall not receive an award if in the opinion of the Judge it is unworthy of such award.

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

- 122 A Person must not administer a Prohibited Substance or cause one to be administered to an Exhibit, except as permitted by the By-Laws or the Regulations.
- 123 The Exhibitor, the Owner and Attendant of any Exhibit to which a Prohibited Substance has been administered is in breach of the By-Laws unless the Prohibited Substance is permitted by the By-Laws or Regulations to be administered.

- 124 An Exhibit to which a Prohibited Substance has been administered in breach of the By-Laws must be removed from the Showground upon demand by the Association.
- 125 The Association may in its discretion and at any time, cause an examination to be made of an Exhibit by a Veterinary Surgeon who, in the course of such examination, may:
- (a) take such samples (including, without limitation, urine, blood, saliva and faeces) from such Exhibit as he considers necessary or advisable;
 - (b) have such samples tested by such methods and procedures as he considers appropriate; and
 - (c) examine the Exhibit for desensitised limbs.
- 126 Any Exhibit found by a Veterinary Surgeon to have a limb (or part thereof) desensitised is deemed to have had administered to it a Prohibited Substance in breach of the By-Laws.
- 127 Where, prior to an event, a Veterinary Surgeon is of the opinion that a Prohibited Substance may have been administered to an Exhibit, the Veterinary Surgeon may require that the Exhibit be examined prior to competing in that event.
- 128 The Association may publish procedures relating to the examination of Exhibits. Such procedures are binding on Exhibitors, Owners and Attendants.
- 129 Any Exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found to have had administered to it any prohibited substance as defined above may, without prejudice to any other action which may be taken in respect of the matter, be debarred by the Council Stewards from competing in any event for which it may have been entered.
- 130 The Exhibitor, the Owner and any person in charge of an animal to which a prohibited substance has been administered, by any person, and whether or not with the knowledge of the Exhibitor, Owner or person in charge, is deemed to have acted in breach of this By-Law.
- 130a No person shall have in his possession on the Showgrounds any prohibited substance, syringe, needle or other instrument which could be used to administer a prohibited substance to an animate Exhibit, unless that person shall have obtained the permission of the Association to be in such possession, or satisfies the Association that such possession is for lawful and proper use.
- 131 The Association and any Council Steward servant or agent of the Association shall not be liable to an Exhibitor for the death of or for injury damage or infection which may be sustained by his Exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any Council Steward, servant or agent of the Association during the course of the testing of the Exhibit whether due to the negligence of any such Council Steward, servant or agent or otherwise.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- 132 If there is any inconsistency between By-Laws 133 - 153 and any other By-Laws of the Association, By-Laws 133 - 153 will prevail.
- Functions of the Disciplinary Committee
- 133 The functions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be to hear and determine all complaints, allegations and other matters relating to:
- (a) prohibited substances, as defined in these By-Laws or Sectional Regulations.
 - (b) any alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association by an Exhibitor and relating to an Exhibit or to a competition, except if the alleged breach is of a kind that the Chairman of a Sectional Committee considers is of a less

serious nature and should properly be dealt with by the Sectional Committee, and

- (c) any other alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association that may be referred to the Disciplinary Committee pursuant to By-Law 137 (a).

Constitution of the Disciplinary Committee

- 134 The Disciplinary Committee shall comprise such members of Council as are appointed by the Council from time to time.
- 135 The Council shall appoint a member of the Disciplinary Committee as Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee.
- 136 For the purposes of any proceedings of the Disciplinary Committee, the Disciplinary Committee shall comprise, subject to By-Law 137, no less than three of its members and those persons shall constitute the Disciplinary Committee for the purpose of those proceedings.
- 137 If a member of the Disciplinary Committee dies or becomes otherwise unable or unwilling to participate in proceedings, then:
- (a) if this occurs prior to the commencement of any hearing in relation to the matter, the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee shall appoint a replacement, and
 - (b) if this occurs after the commencement of any commencement of any hearing in relation to the matter, the remaining members of the Disciplinary Committee shall constitute the Committee for the purposes of concluding the proceedings.

Initiation of Proceedings before the Disciplinary Proceedings

- 138 Proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee may be initiated:
- (a) upon the request, orally or in writing, of the President, any Chairman of a Sectional Committee or Chief Executive.
 - (b) upon receipt by the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee of a written complaint relating to a matter referred to in paragraphs (a) or (b) of By-Law 133.
 - (c) by the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee on his or her own motion.

Conduct of Proceedings

- 139 The Disciplinary Committee may conduct proceedings at any time between 6.00am and 11.00pm on any day.
- 140 All persons who constitute the Disciplinary Committee for the purposes of any proceedings must be present at any hearing conducted by the Disciplinary Committee.
- 141 A person whose conduct is called into question in any proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee must be given notice of a hearing. It shall be sufficient for such notice to be given orally and by any such person acting with the apparent authority of the Association.
- 142 The Disciplinary Committee may conduct proceedings notwithstanding that any person who has been given notice fails to attend the proceedings.
- 143 The Disciplinary Committee shall not be bound by any rules of evidence and shall conduct the proceedings with the minimum of formality and in such a manner as it sees fit.

144 The Disciplinary Committee may require any member or Exhibitor to attend at any proceedings of the Disciplinary Committee and to furnish such information and evidence and to produce such documents relevant to the proceedings as the Disciplinary Committee seems fit.

145 The Disciplinary Committee may, at its discretion, call for and hear expert evidence.

146 No person will be legally represented without the leave of the Disciplinary Committee.

Decisions of the Disciplinary Committee

147 The Disciplinary Committee may announce its decision orally or in writing. A decision that is announced orally shall have effect in accordance with its terms.

148 If the opinion of the Disciplinary Committee is not unanimous, the decision of the majority shall prevail. The Disciplinary Committee are equally divided on any question concerning the guilt or innocence of a person, the question shall be resolved in that person's favour.

PENALTIES

149 If the Disciplinary Committee considers that there has been a breach of the Rules, By-Laws or regulations of the Association, it may impose such a penalty as it considers to be appropriate, including without limitation:

- (a) a reprimand;
- (b) a monetary fine (payable at such time/s and in such manner as the Disciplinary Committee may determine);
- (c) withdrawal or withholding of any award or ribbon;
- (d) disqualification in respect of any class;
- (e) expulsion from the Showground;
- (f) where the person concerned is a member, a suspension or termination of that membership;
- (g) a ban;
- (h) exclusion;
- (i) prohibiting a Person from Exhibiting or competing at the current Show or at any future Show;
- (j) a direction that an Exhibit be removed from the Showground;
- (k) any other mandatory requirement; and
- (l) any other penalty provided for in other regulations of the Association.

150 There shall be no appeal from any decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

Publication of Results of Disciplinary Procedures

151 The Association may publish to:

- (a) all Royal Show Societies in Australia;
- (b) the relevant Breed Societies;
- (c) the body with which the Exhibit is registered, or is eligible for registration;

the result of any proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee in which a person has been found guilty of a breach of any Rule, By-Law or Regulation.

152 The Association shall have no liability to any person in respect of any publication referred to in paragraph (a).

153 No person shall have any claim against the Association or against any Councillor, member, employee or agent of the Association in respect of any act, matter or thing done in good faith during or in connection with the proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee.

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Entries Department.

NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

Entries will only be received on the "Application to Enter" form enclosed with this Schedule. Entries submitted other than on the correct form will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with and the forms returned to the office by 4.30pm on the "Application to Enter" closing date as shown in the Schedule, they will not be considered.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

You can be assured that the privacy of your personal information is of the utmost importance to us. The information provided by you in any application for membership or application to enter is used by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (RNA) to offer member services or to organise and conduct competitions at the Royal Queensland Show. By applying for membership or entering such competitions you consent to provide such details as your name, address and Exhibit details. Competition information may be made available to the media and included in RNA publications.

Your information will not be disclosed without your consent for any other purpose unless required by the law. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 1995

1. The RNA Showgrounds is a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Act and Exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the RNA holds each Exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the Exhibitor/competitor of any area of the RNA Showgrounds.
2. Each Exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other Exhibitors, RNA staff, show visitors and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their Exhibit.
3. Risks identified by Exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the Exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other Exhibitors/competitors.
4. Exhibits will only be led and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the Exhibitor/competitor.
5. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by Exhibitors/competitors and Exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in the horse stalls or pavilions.
6. Any Exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must be tested and tagged.

7. All Exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect.

This is essential for the safety of all Exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.

Any Exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to Exhibit at the Brisbane Exhibition.

VETERINARY SERVICES

The Association Council is pleased to advise that for the forthcoming Royal Queensland Show arrangements have again been made for veterinary services to be available on a 24 hour basis commencing on Saturday 30 July 2011 through until Saturday 20 August 2011.

The official veterinary surgeons are permitted to charge their normal consultation fees plus an hourly rate for extended services. In addition Exhibitors will be required to pay the cost of all drugs used. Exhibitors will be responsible for the payment of all monies owing to the veterinary surgeons.

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS WILL APPLY TO STOCK AND VEHICLES MOVING ON TO THE RNA SHOWGROUNDS

MAJOR CHANGES:

Livestock from Queensland require a Queensland Travel Permit and a Move Easy Waybill or a NVD/Waybill. Livestock from NSW entering Queensland via Tweed Heads or Mt Lindsay Border Crossings require a Queensland Travel Permit and a Move Easy Waybill or a NVD/Waybill. Livestock from NSW entering Queensland from Killarney west require a Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill.

STOCK GENERAL

1. Only tick free stock will be allowed entry to the grounds.
2. All Queensland horses, cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys, angoras, alpacas, deer, camels and mules must be accompanied by a DPI&F Travel Permit endorsed with treatments performed (if necessary) and an owner Waybill.
3. **QUEENSLAND STOCK NOT ACCOMPANIED BY A DPI&F TRAVEL PERMIT AND FULLY COMPLETED OWNER WAYBILL WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY TO THE GROUNDS.**
4. **ALPACAS FROM AND RETURNING TO NEW SOUTH WALES**

Tweed Heads & Mt Lindsay crossings. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Travel Permit
- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

Other Border Crossings from Killarney west have closed. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

The requirement to seal vehicles carrying all classes of livestock has been waived. Alpacas must travel direct to the RNA showgrounds without unloading enroute.

Exhibitors should be aware that NSW/Queensland Border Crossings at Tweed Heads no longer operate 24 hours. They now operate from 5.00 am to 9.00 pm. The Border Crossings from Killarney west are unstaffed. Exhibitors should make prior arrangements with the respective Border Crossing before commencing their journey. Arrangements for the return journey should be made at the RNA Stock Office.

TICK TREATMENTS (EX TICK INFECTED ZONES)

- Alpacas from the Tick Infected zones in Queensland – Permit and "Owner Declaration and Waybill" required.
- Alpacas must be Tick Free.
- Alpacas which have been housed and groomed for a minimum of 35 days and held separately from other stock during that period need a permit only. The requirement to treat and inspect has been waived.
- It is the responsibility of alpaca owners to ensure their charges are tick free. Alpacas which have had any risk of exposure to cattle tick should be treated by the owner with an approved tickicide 3-7 days prior to entry. The tickicide used and date administered should be provided to the local Inspector of Stock when obtaining your Travel Permit.
- All alpacas must be presented to the standard expected at a Royal National Show. Alpacas which do not come up to standard may be refused entry or asked to leave the grounds. Random

inspections will be conducted on other alpacas from Tick Infected Zones.

JOHNE'S DISEASE – for Bovine Johne's disease.

Alpacas wishing to enter the RNA must comply with the conditions for animals to enter Queensland:-

1. Originate from a free herd in a Johne's disease Protected or Free Zone zone (Queensland is a protected zone); or
2. Originate from a Check Tested Negative herd or a MAP Monitored Negative 1 (MN1) or equivalent (Q-Alpaca) or better herd in a BJD Control Zone or a MAP MN1 or equivalent (Q-Alpaca) or better herd in a BJD Residual Zone ; or
3. Other – The herd history to be provided to RNA at the time of nomination. Each will be assessed by the RNA Animal Health Committee. Prior approval required from Principle Vet Officer, Biosecurity Qld.

ALPACAS

Subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules and By-Laws of the Association the following General Regulations shall apply to the Alpaca breed.

CONDITIONS

1. This Schedule form part of these AAA Ltd. approved conditions of entry. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these conditions, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise. This Show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. as set out in the current AAA Ltd. Showing Rules Manual effective 11 February 2011.
2. All exhibitors should read the conditions on the entry form and ensure that they can comply with those conditions before signing the entry form, particularly noting the condition dealing with animal health. A separate health declaration will be provided for signature and return with the entry form. Failure to sign the entry form will render all alpacas of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited. Please note that only the registered owner of an exhibit, or his/her authorised agent may sign an entry form. Any entry form that is incomplete will be returned to the Exhibitor and must be returned by closing date of entries.
3. The registered owner of an exhibit must be a financial member of the AAA Ltd.
4. Alpacas traveling interstate must comply with that State's Department of Industry requirements.
5. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to declare their Johne's Disease status in accordance with the Australian Johne's Disease Market Assurance Program for Alpacas.
6. **Period of Exhibition:** Alpacas must be penned by 6pm Monday 15 August 2011 and may not be removed from the Showgrounds until after 3pm Wednesday 17 August 2011. Non-compliance will mean forfeiture of any prizes.
7. **Preparation of Exhibits and Cleanliness of Stalls:** Exhibitors or their agents, must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean, and give proper attention to their stock throughout the Show. Exhibitors must provide their own feed, and feed and water containers.
8. **Advertising:** Each Exhibitor may display one stud sign not exceeding 75cm x 75cm but shall remove any such sign forthwith if directed to do so by the Council Steward who shall have full power to give such direction without giving any reason whatsoever. For sale signs are not permitted. Display/promotional alpacas are not permitted. Ribbons won at any other previous show are not permitted.
9. The Exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their Exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.

10. **Companion animals and dogs:** No companion alpacas will be permitted. No dogs are permitted into the precinct of where Show animals are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide Dogs are exempt.

11. **Inspection of Exhibits:** All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpaca's IAR number. A copy of the pedigree certificate of each alpaca entered (both sides) must accompany the entry form. Note – wethers must also be registered with the AAA as per Showing Rules effective 11 February 2011.

12. No wether may have any visible genetic faults or visible physical disfigurement.

13. No animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire (except for wethers). All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.

14. The Convenor, with the consultation of the Show Committee of a Show conducted under Association Rules, shall appoint a person, or persons, as a qualified inspector, or inspectors, who shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number and visible physical disfigurement.

15. **IAR Ear Tag:** If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an animal exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Replacement tag orders and payments must be lodged with the National Office a minimum of one week before the date of the show. Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the animal.

16. The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for age, sex and colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

17. The use of hormones and/or tranquillisers is prohibited. Any Exhibitor violating this Regulation will be dealt with by the Council.

18. An animal which in the opinion of the Council Steward is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected and barred from competing in the class for which it is entered. Any animal rejected must be removed from the RNA Showgrounds if so ordered by the Council Steward.

19. The Chief Steward, upon finding infestation of lice or mites on an alpaca during the course of inspection, shall order immediate removal from the showground of that animal and of any other alpaca present at that show which belongs to the Exhibitor of the infested animal.

20. It is the responsibility of each Exhibitor to provide bedding the type being optional. Bedding straw may be purchased from the Product Merchant on the Showgrounds.

21. All alpacas shall be penned by Monday 15 August 2011 6pm and inspection will commence thereafter. Alpacas not in their allocated pens and available for inspection at the official time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Exhibitors must be in attendance at the time of the inspection and will be required to assist.

22. **Fleece Length:** Exhibits of huacayas must carry a minimum fleece length of 50mm and a recommended maximum length not exceeding 130mm. The minimum fleece length for suris is 75mm and fleece length will be assessed by the Judge. Exhibits shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece. Huacaya 12 months and older must be shorn regularly so that no more than 15 months fleece is carried at the time of showing.

23. No Alpacas shall be removed from the pen without permission of the Exhibitor or his representative and the Steward other than for the purpose of judging and exercising. All animals must be exercised and returned to their pens by 8.00am each day. No grazing allowed on site. All Exhibitors must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Show Stewards and must not be moved or removed except by order of the Chief Steward.

24. **Exhibitors' Meeting:** The Chief Steward requests that all exhibitors attend a meeting in the show ring at 8am Tuesday 16 August 2011 to be briefed on Show procedures.

25. **Judging:** will commence promptly at 9am Tuesday 16 August 2011. A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas or proposed exhibits prior to, or during the Show judging.

26. **Champion prizes:** All first place winners of each class to compete. After selecting the Champion, the Judge will be required to select an animal for Reserve. The Reserve Champion shall be selected from the remaining first prize animals together with the second prize winner of the class which furnished the Champion. The Judge's decision shall be final. He/she may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.

27. **Handlers Attire:** All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or parade shall wear a white coat over long black trousers or long skirts, with clean dress shoes or boots. The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire. A handler shall be deemed to be incorrectly attired if his/her dress or the animal being led displays any information capable of being construed as advertising for any stud.

28. The animal exhibit number card of the exhibit must be worn and clearly displayed by the handler whilst in the show ring. The age of the alpaca and the age of fleece, in months, will be displayed on the card.

29. All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit, or removal from the ring may be requested by the Judge. It is recommended that small children not exhibit large animals that they cannot control.

30. **Fleece Exhibits:** All fleeces being exhibited (including wether fleeces) must be the bona fide property of an AAA Ltd. Financial member. All fleeces being shown must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Fleeces are to be received at C/- Show Convenor, PO Box 1804, Toowong QLD 4066 by 6pm Friday 29 July 2011. Only one fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one animal. It is recommended that fleeces be placed in bags, made of satin or similar material, or heavy duty plastic. Plastic garbage bags should be avoided. Exhibitors, when submitting fleeces at the Show, must attach to the fleece the number supplied for that class (no names or identifying markers allowed). Stamped return addressed postage should be supplied or Exhibitors will be charged with the return costs.

31. **Correct Animal Colour Classification: An alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour.** Any colour variations will be assessed at the time of inspection. Any colour variations will be assessed at the Judge's discretion. Judges decision is final. As a guide –

32. **White:** constitutes a pristine bright white fleece.

33. **Light fawn:** Alpacas with cream or "off white" fleeces, or have light fawn on the neck or backline. These should be entered into the light fawn class.

34. **Roan alpaca** constitutes a fawn, brown or black alpaca with white fibres throughout the fleece.

35. **Grey** - A predominantly grey alpaca is to be shown in a grey class, whether or not it has any other coloured spots present, and any colour variations will be assessed at the Judge's discretion.

36. **Fancy** alpaca is to be shown in a fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of colour e.g. different coloured saddle markings. A non solid coloured animal with different colour markings on the head, chest, or legs does not constitute a fancy alpaca.

37. **Age of Alpaca:** The age of alpacas will be calculated as at 1 August 2011.

38. **Sires Progeny Class:** The class is for three progeny by one sire. There shall be at least two entries in the sire progeny class before the class will take place. A Sires Progeny entry cannot contain a wether, but may be a group of males, females or males and females. Progeny need not be owned or bred by the one exhibitor, but all must be the progeny of the one sire and drawn from ordinary classes. All progeny must have been entered as animal exhibits in the same Show as that in which they are to be exhibited as Sires Progeny. Only one progeny from any one dam may be shown in each sires progeny group unless the progeny have been born at least eleven months apart.

39. **Entry and entry fees for progeny group:** Only one entry fee per group is required. The progeny group must be entered before commencement of the Judging at 9am Tuesday 16 August 2011.

40. **Grand Parade:** Subject to Show Society requirements, the prize winning animals may be requested to take part in the Grand Parade. Alpacas with Q Alpaca or MN Status are exempt.

41. **Protests:** Only an exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The protest shall be lodged in writing together with a deposit of \$50, which shall be refunded if the protest is upheld. The sole grounds for a protest shall be a breach of the Show Rules. Protests shall be lodged with the Chief Steward or Show Convenor within one hour of the end of the day's showing (when the last animal leaves the ring). The Chief Steward shall set up a Protest Committee prior to the commencement of the Show. The Committee shall comprise the Chief Steward as the Chair and two ordinary members not associated with the alleged incident. IF an alleged incident occurred resulting in a protest in a class where the Chief Steward was exhibiting and his or her exhibit may have some bearing on the outcome of the protest then the Chief Steward would stand aside and be replaced by the Show Convenor or another suitable member. A meeting will be convened within 30 minutes of the protest being received. The Protest Committee shall immediately investigate the protest and if found to be valid, initiate appropriate action. Complaints against Judges are to be put in writing, within one week of the alleged incident, addressed to the AAA Ltd. National Secretary, c/- AAA Ltd. National Office accompanied by a \$50 fee, which will be refunded in the event that the complaint is upheld.

42. **Huacaya Sections and Class Numbers:** The judging of suri classes and championships will occur first in the Show Program at the Judges discretion.

43. **Splitting of classes:** All classes over 20 animals are to be split evenly from youngest to oldest. (Example: 30 Junior white females - remove class 101 and replace with 101A - 15 alpacas & 101B - 15 alpacas. Sorted from youngest in 101A to oldest in 101B).

44. **Biosecurity:** Exhibitors must comply with all directions regarding biosecurity requirements as advised.

45. **ACCOMMODATION FEE:** A fee of \$10.00 per bed per night will be charged for all Alpaca Exhibitors using RNA Accommodation facilities. This fee is to be paid on arrival on grounds at time of allocation from the Stud Beef Superintendents Office. Schools will be charged \$5.00 per bed per night.

Subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association the following General Regulations shall apply to the Angora Breed.

Shearing Date - After 1 January 2011

CONDITIONS

1. All Angoras in the Stud Classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor as owner with Mohair Australia Limited or registration papers lodged by the closing date of entries to procure registration. Entries are confined to purebred animals only, appendix or grade animals specially excluded.

2. Each exhibitors must state on his Application to Enter form the number of classes in which he intends to compete, and full particulars of each animal entered, viz: Name in full, Date of Birth, Sire, Dam, and Stud Book Number of each animal to be stated. The responsibility of the eligibility of each animal entered rests solely with the exhibitor and the correctness of these matters and tattoos shall be confirmed prior to judging by an inspector appointed by Mohair Australia Limited Queensland Division. Any Application to Enter form that is incomplete will be returned to the exhibitor and must be returned by closing date of entries.

Exhibitors will have to produce registration certificates if required.

3. Upon arrival on the RNA Showgrounds all animals will be inspected by the Stewards and those whose description is not consistent with the details printed in the catalogue must be removed from the RNA Showgrounds if so ordered by the Council Steward.

4. All exhibits in the Commercial Classes will be mouthed by the Stewards upon arrival on the RNA Showgrounds and any animal found to be ineligible to compete in the Commercial Classes must be removed from the RNA Showgrounds if so ordered by the Council Steward.

5. Not more than 3 entries may be made by any exhibitor in any one Class.

6. **Stud Angoras are not permitted on the RNA Showgrounds before Tuesday 16 August 2011 at 2.00pm and must be penned by 6.00pm on that day.**

7. All Angoras may leave the RNA Showgrounds after 3.00pm on Saturday 20 August 2011 and in any case must have vacated the RNA Showgrounds by 6.00pm on that day.

8. Angoras entered in a class for which it is found they are not eligible may be transferred to any other class for which they are eligible.

9. No Angoras during the Show shall be removed from the pen without permission of the exhibitor or his representative and the Steward other than for the purpose of judging.

Angoras shall not be required to participate in the Grand Parades as led animals.

10. For Champion prizes all first prize winners of each class to compete. After selecting the Champion, the Judge will be required to select an animal for Reserve. The reserve shall be selected from the remaining first prize animals together with the second prize winner of the class which furnished the Champion.

11. An animal which in the opinion of the Council Steward is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected by him and be barred from competing in the class for which it is entered. Any animal rejected must be removed from the Showgrounds if so ordered by the Council Steward.

12. In the event of the Judge deciding that the exhibits in any Class or Championship are not worthy of any prize he shall use his discretion as to what prize, if any, to allot.

13. All Angoras shall be fed and attended to by exhibitors or their agents, who shall be responsible for their cleanliness and proper condition of the pens.

14. The age of Angoras will be calculated as at 1 August 2011.

15. The use of hormones and/or tranquilizers is prohibited. Any exhibitor violating this Regulation will be dealt with by the Council.

16. All animals must be clearly tattooed prior to the Exhibition.

17. Each exhibitor may display one sign not exceeding 75cm x 75cm but shall remove any such sign forthwith if directed to do so by the Council Steward who shall have full power to give such direction without giving any reason therefore.

18. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.

19. **ACCOMMODATION FEE: A fee of \$10.00 per bed per night will be charged for all Stud Angora Exhibitors using RNA Accommodation facilities. This fee is to be paid on arrival on grounds at time of allocation from the Stud Beef Superintendents Office. Schools will be charged \$5.00 per bed per night.**

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS WILL APPLY TO STOCK AND VEHICLES MOVING ON TO THE RNA SHOWGROUNDS

MAJOR CHANGES:

STOCK GENERAL

1. NLIS – All sheep goats on the grounds must be identified in an approved manner before leaving the property of origin.

2. Only tick free stock will be allowed entry to the grounds.

3. All Queensland horses, cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys, angoras, alpacas, deer, camels and mules must be accompanied by a DPI&F Travel Permit endorsed with treatments performed (if necessary) and an owner Waybill.

4. **QUEENSLAND STOCK NOT ACCOMPANIED BY A DPI&F TRAVEL PERMIT AND FULLY COMPLETED OWNER WAYBILL WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY TO THE GROUNDS.**

5. **ANGORAS FROM AND RETURNING TO NEW SOUTH WALES.**

Tweed Heads & Mt Lindsay crossings. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Travel Permit
- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- National goat health statement
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

Other Border Crossings from Killarney west have closed. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- National goat health statement
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

Stock must travel direct to the Exhibition Grounds. A Queensland Travel Permit will be issued at the RNA Grounds for the return journey.

The requirement to seal vehicles carrying all classes of livestock has been waived. Angoras must travel direct to the RNA showgrounds without unloading enroute.

Exhibitors should be aware that NSW/Queensland Border Crossings at Tweed Heads and Mt Lindsay no longer operate 24 hours. They now operate from 5.00 am to 9.00 pm. TICK TREATMENTS (EX TICK INFECTED ZONES)

- Angoras from the Tick Infected zones in Queensland – Permit and "Owner Declaration and Waybill" waybill required.
- Angoras must be Tick Free.
- It is the responsibility of angora owners to ensure their charges are tick free. Any angoras which have had any risk of exposure to cattle tick should be treated by the owner with an approved tickicide 3-7 days prior to entry. The tickicide used and date administered should be provided to the local Inspector of Stock when obtaining your Travel Permit.

JOHNE'S DISEASE – for both Bovine Johne's disease (BJD) and Ovine Johne's disease (OJD).

Goats must not be introduced unless they comply with the conditions to enter Queensland:

1. They are from an unrestricted herd in a zone declared by another State or Territory as a Protected Zone or Free Zone for BJD and a Very Low Prevalence Area for OJD; or
2. They are from a Check Tested (negative) (CT(n)), Monitored Negative 1 (MN1) or equivalent or better status herd established under the Market Assurance Program (MAP) for goats if they originate from a Control Zone for BJD (cattle), or a Low Prevalence area or better for OJD; (the conditions for the Zone or Area of lower status apply); or
3. They are from a MN1 or equivalent or better status herd in a Residual Zone for BJD, or a Medium or High Prevalence Area for OJD; or
4. They are from an MN1 status herd if they are from a property that adjoins an OJD Infected (IN) property.
5. Other – The herd history to be provided to RNA at the time of nomination. Each will be assessed by the RNA Animal Health Committee. Prior approval required from Principle.

4. If exhibits are not collected personally at the conclusion of the show the Association will re-pack and re-address or deliver exhibits to any nominated authorised Wool Broker or Classing House, if so instructed, or re-addressed to the place of origin. In this regard no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage in transit. All Exhibitors are requested to include precise instructions as to the desired method of disposal at the conclusion of the Show.
5. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee. No fleece will be accepted unless full freight has been prepaid.
6. With the exception of the Commercial Mohair competition the Judges will transfer any fleece to the class to which it rightfully belongs. All fleece must be skirted to the satisfaction of the Judge. Fleeces which in the opinion of the Judges are overgrown, will be judged accordingly.

STOCK GENERAL

1. NLIS – All sheep entering the grounds must be identified in an approved manner before leaving the property of origin.
2. Only tick free stock will be allowed entry to the grounds.
3. All Queensland horses, cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys, angoras, alpacas, deer, camels and mules must be accompanied by a DPI&F Travel Permit endorsed with treatments performed (if necessary) and an owner Waybill.
4. **QUEENSLAND STOCK NOT ACCOMPANIED BY A DPI&F TRAVEL PERMIT AND FULLY COMPLETED OWNER WAYBILL WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY TO THE GROUNDS.**
5. **SHEEP FROM AND RETURNING TO NEW SOUTH WALES or VICTORIA**

Tweed Heads & Mt Lindsay crossings. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Travel Permit
- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

Other Border Crossings from Killarney west have closed. Stock crossing at these crossings require:

- Queensland Certificate of Health/Waybill - should be obtained from your local Department or Livestock Health and Pest Authority prior to the movement commencing.
- Owner Declaration – these will be sent out when nominations are confirmed.

Stock must travel direct to the Exhibition Grounds. A Queensland Travel Permit will be issued at the RNA Grounds for the return journey.

Sheep must travel direct to the RNA showgrounds without unloading enroute.

Exhibitors should be aware that NSW/Queensland Border Crossings at Tweed Heads and Mt Lindsay no longer operate 24 hours. They now operate from 5.00 am to 9.00 pm. Exhibitors should make prior arrangements with the respective Border Crossing before commencing their journey. Arrangements for the return journey should be made at the RNA Stock Office.

TICK TREATMENTS (EX TICK INFECTED ZONES)

- Sheep from the Tick Infected zones in Queensland and Interstate – Permit and “Move Easy” waybill required.
- Sheep must be Tick Free.
- Sheep, which have been housed and groomed for a minimum of 35 days and held separately from other stock during that period, need a permit only. The requirement to treat and inspect has been waived.
- It is the responsibility of sheep owners to ensure their charges are tick free. Sheep that have had any risk of exposure to cattle tick should be treated by the owner with an approved tickicide 3-7 days prior to entry. The tickicide used and date administered should be provided to the local Inspector of Stock when obtaining your Travel Permit.
- All sheep must be presented to the standard expected at a Royal National Show. Sheep which do not come up to standard, may be refused entry or asked to leave the grounds. Sheep from the Infected Zone staying at the RNA grounds for longer than 5 days may be inspected at the grounds. Random inspections will be conducted on other sheep from Tick Infected Zones.

STUD SHEEP: - ALL BREEDS

Apart from general and tick control conditions the following conditions will also apply.

BRUCELLOSIS

All stud breeding ewes and rams exhibited will be derived from flocks, which hold a current Certificate re Flock Accreditation for Ovine Brucellosis issued, by the appropriate body in the state of origin.

Other non breeding animals e.g. fat lambs, fat hogget's will not require testing but will be isolated from breeding animals within the Sheep and Wool Pavilion.

JOHNE'S DISEASE – for Bovine Johne's disease.

Sheep shall not be permitted entry:

1. From a property or flock in which Ovine Johne's disease is known or suspected to exist; and
2. From any Area unless the property of origin has attained 5 ABC credit points or better. Sheep from the Exclusion Area of NSW must from a property which attained 4 ABC credit points or better.
3. Sheep must be accompanied by a Qld Certificate Health waybill and a National Sheep Heal Statement

A property where bovine Johne's Disease has been diagnosed will be classed as infected for the purpose of moving cattle, goats, camelids and deer, but not sheep.

A property where Ovine Johne's Disease has been diagnosed will be classed as infected for the purpose of moving sheep, goats, camelids and deer. Cattle from the property will remain eligible for entry into Queensland provided the normal conditions for cattle movements have been met.

ACCOMMODATION FEE

A fee of \$10.00 per bed per night will be charged for all Stud Sheep Exhibitors using RNA Accommodation facilities. This fee is to be paid on arrival on grounds at time of allocation from the Stud Beef Superintendents Office. Schools will be charged \$5.00 per bed per night.

LANDMARK STUD SHEEP SCHOOLS COMPETITION

STUD SHEEP CONDITIONS

1. Stud Sheep are not permitted on the RNA Showgrounds before Tuesday 16 August 2011 at 12.00pm and must be penned by 6.00pm on that day. The sheep must remain on display until 3.00pm Saturday 20 August 2011 and must have vacated the grounds by 6.00pm on that day.
2. All sheep entered in these classes must be the bona fide property of a registered stud breeder and in the care of the entering school from the beginning of the 2011 school year. Where sheep are shown in conjunction with another registered stud, the school must have written proof of such joint venture or ownership from the beginning of the 2011 school year.
3. Sheep entered in a class for which it is found they are not eligible may be transferred to any other class for which they are eligible.
4. No sheep during the Show shall be removed from the pen without permission of the exhibitor or his representative and the Stewards other than for the purpose of judging.
5. Arrangements must be made by the exhibitor concerned for the holding of his sheep during judging.
6. All male sheep exhibited must be physically entire.
7. For Champion prizes all first prize winners of each class and sex to compete. After selecting the Champion, the Judge will be required to select an animal for Reserve. **The Reserve shall be selected from the remaining first prize animals together with the second prize winner of the class which furnished the Champion**
8. Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number and no particulars other than the exhibitor's name will be published in the catalogue. The responsibility for the eligibility of each animal entered rests solely with the exhibitor and the correctness of these matters and tattoos shall be confirmed prior to judging by an inspector appointed by the respective breed Society. All rams shall be manually examined for soundness on the RNA Showgrounds prior to judging by a qualified veterinary surgeon.

Inspection of stud sheep will be on Wednesday 17 August 2011 commencing at 10.00am.
9. An animal which in the opinion of the Council Stewards is not in a fit state to be exhibited, or does not comply with Regulation 8, may be rejected by him and be barred from competing in the class for which it is entered. An animal rejected must be removed from the RNA Showgrounds if so ordered by the Council Steward.
10. In the event of there being no competition in a class the merit of the exhibit shall be the sole guide in the awarding or withholding of any prize, also if the merit of exhibits in any class is not, in the opinion of the Judge, sufficient to entitle them to a prize or champion award, the Judge may withhold any or all prizes in the class.
11. All sheep shall be fed and attended to by exhibitors or their agents, who shall be responsible for their cleanliness and proper condition of the pens.
12. The age of sheep will be calculated as at judging day.
13. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.
14. All sheep to be shorn on or as close to 1 May 2011 as possible, to ensure evenness of wool cover for all sheep entered.
15. In classes of ewes showing two teeth and four teeth, if they have lambs, these lambs may be brought into the judging ring with the ewe at the time of judging.

INSPECTION OF SHEEP

All Stud Sheep exhibited will be inspected by persons nominated by the respective Society in accordance with the Rules of that Society. SCALE OF JUDGING

As set out by the National Council of Wool Selling Brokers of Australia and complimented with objective measurement factor that the Association General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder apply to this section only, and are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Exhibitors must attach a tag showing name and address and class number to each fleece, and also to the wrapping used.

If the exhibits are sent by rail, they must be securely packing and addressed to: The Entries Departments, RNA Showgrounds, Gregory Terrace, Fortitude Valley, QLD, 4006. **Fleeces are to be on the grounds by Wednesday 13 July 2011.**

All Exhibitors are requested to include precise instructions as to the desired method of disposal at the conclusion of the Show.

The Association will re-pack and re-address or deliver exhibits to any nominated authorised Wool Broker or Classing House, if so instructed, or re-address to place of origin. In this regard no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage in transit.

No fleece will be accepted unless full freight has been prepaid. Return freight is also the responsibility of the exhibitor and must be prepaid if the fleece is to be returned to the exhibitor. The Judges will transfer any fleece to the class to which it rightfully belongs.

All fleeces must be skirted to the satisfaction of the Honorary Council Stewards. Fleeces which in the opinion of the Judges are overgrown, will be judged accordingly.

A fleece shall be the wool shorn from one sheep at the one time. An entry which in the opinion of the Council Steward does not comply with the aforesaid condition shall be rejected and shall not be judged. Future entries by the owner of any such entry for any class or classes in the Sheep & Wool Section of the Association may be rejected.

In the event of the Judge deciding that the fleeces in any class or Championship are not worthy of any prize he shall use his discretion as to what prize, if any, to allot. All fleeces are to be shorn from sheep that are the bona fide property of the exhibitors.

The Association shall not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any exhibit irrespective of the cause of such loss or damage.

In the event of there being no competition in a class the merit of the exhibit shall be the sole guide in awarding or withholding of any prize, also if the merit of exhibits in any class is not, in the opinion of the Judge, sufficient to entitle them to a prize, the Judge may withhold any or all prizes in the class.

The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the RNA publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or the internet.
