Judging will be performed by a panel of Judges appointed by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland.

Subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association the following Special General Regulations shall apply.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Entries Department.

No refunds will be made after close of entry.

### NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

Entries for 2012 can be made either on the Application to Enter Form enclosed with this schedule or online at [www.royalqueenslandshow.com.au](http://www.royalqueenslandshow.com.au). Entries submitted other than on the correct form or online will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with and the forms returned to the office by 4.30pm on the Application to Enter closing date, as shown in the Schedule, they will not be considered.

### ENTRY FORMS

Exhibitors **must complete** "STATEMENT BY EXHIBITOR" section on the front page of the entry form advising their taxation status.

### PRIZE MONEY

Prize Money stated in the Schedule **excludes GST**.

GST will be added to the Prize Money for Exhibitors who are **registered for GST purposes**.

The Association will provide a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.

### WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

1. The RNA Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the RNA

holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the RNA Showgrounds.

2. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, RNA staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
3. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
4. Exhibits will only be led and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor.
5. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in the pavilions.
6. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.
7. All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect.

This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.

Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Royal Queensland Show.

### DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

132. It there is any inconsistency between By-laws 133 - 153 and any other By-laws of the Association, By-laws 133 - 153 will prevail.

(Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Entries Department.)

### Functions of the Disciplinary Committee

133. The functions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be to hear and determine all complaints, allegations and other matters relating to:
  - (a) prohibited substances, as defined in these By-laws or Sectional Regulations.
  - (b) any alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association by an exhibitor and relating to an exhibit or to a competition, except if the alleged breach is of a kind that the Chairman of a Sectional Committee considers is of a less serious nature and should properly be dealt with by the Sectional Committee, and

any other alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association that may be referred to Disciplinary Committee pursuant to By-Law 137 (a).

Education on Show covers a wide range of contemporary curriculum related skills, activities and learning areas. The competition has been designed to encourage students to strive to do their best as the school's selected best works will be judged and on display at Ekka. It has also been designed to encourage teachers to use the competition as a resource tool for assessment.

## 2012 THEME

### OUR FARMERS. OUR FUTURE

2012 is the Australian Year of the Farmer and the Education on Show competition is celebrating the contribution farmers make to the Australian economy and community.

Farming is inherent to the Australian way of life and the Australian Year of the Farmer showcases the vital role farmers play in feeding the nation, leading the world in farming techniques and innovation, and for sustaining the vital agribusinesses that underpin our economy. Farmers are the providers of our nation.

The Ekka continues to be Queensland's biggest and most anticipated yearly event and continues to achieve it's aim of connecting Queenslanders of all ages, bridging the city and country divide. The Australian Year of the Farmer is about celebrating and enriching the connections between rural and urban Australia.

### COMPETITION SCOPE

All entries must be created in the 2012 school calendar year.

Schools are encouraged to conduct their own competitions and to send their best works to Ekka to be judged.

Students are to be encouraged to provide work that demonstrates a balance between ICT skills and hand generated presentations.

## WHO CAN ENTER

The competition is open to all year levels. Special Needs and Distance Education schools are encouraged to enter. Class eligibility is determined by student's year level. All entries must be made via the school.
