City kids get a taste of farm life in Ekka countdown

Almost 1,300 school students, 290 teachers and parents, 80 animals and 34 primary industries presenters will descend on the RNA Showgrounds tomorrow for a day designed to bridge the city/country divide. This year marks the 10th RNA Rural Discovery Day which continues to teach primary school students about all things rural to develop an understanding of where their food, fibre and foliage come from. With just 77 days until Ekka 2012, tomorrow will provide students with a taste of some of the educational and animal experiences to be had at the show including milking a cow, sampling some of Queensland's best produce, watching sheep dogs in action and cuddling baby animals. Presenters include EcoMarines from Tangalooma, Chef Carmel with her Kids in the Kitchen program and the green thumbs from Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden, alpacas, beef cattle, horses, goats and dairy cattle.
