In Lyn's own words:

"Mothers In Arms is an initiative to connect new mums with experienced mums - to share life experiences, challenges and wins. It's a support program that helps mums understand themselves and accept that not everything will be or has to be perfect. Our buddy mums provide peer support and should our mums require additional professional support, our partners Virtual Psychologists will connect and provide our mums with next level support. This is a partnership of care.

We appreciate and thank you for the contribution that is being offering to BushED, We know it will make a huge impact to hundreds of rural and remote women's lives. Your donation will also help many in rural and remote QLD to receive resources to help prepare them for their teaching role whilst at the same time providing the new born with stimulating educational related materials that will help mum and child be up to speed on day 1 of schooling."





Lyn's passionate presentation included her own personal experience in raising three children while living in remote outback Qld. Her heartfelt words resonated well with the rural guests. Many (now with grown up children), remember those early days of returning home with their newborn baby – often hundreds of kilometres from the nearest neighbouring property.

Also attending was Selena Gomersall from 'Outback Futures'. Our funds last year went towards implementing their 'Rumbles Quest' within the Mt Isa region.

ABC Television commentator, Pip Courtney. Pip has covered (for more than 30 years) Australian-wide issues that affect the bush. In 2011, she was named as the world's best agricultural reporter and has subsequently been inducted into the Rural Press Club's Rural Journalism Hall of Fame.

Pip opened the event by introducing our Governor, Her Excellency the Honourable Doctor Jeanette Young AC PSM. The Governor spoke knowledgeably of the difficulties experienced by those who live hundreds/sometimes thousands of kilometres from 'big city' amenities.

She also stressed how important it is that people who are living in remote regions know that others actually care about them.





The Governor's address was followed by a viewing of the traditional EKKA Fashion Parade. This year, for the first time, the event featured children's apparel – paraded by four delightful young models (aged between 5-7 years).

At the conclusion of the Fashion Parade everyone remained seated for the 'Live' Auction. We were delighted to again welcome professional cattle/sheep auctioneer Bernadette Binnie from Tamworth.

Four major items went under her hammer:

- * One week's accommodation in a 3 Bedroom Penthouse at 'Costa Nova'. This Sunshine Beach venue features huge ocean, beach and coastline views and was donated by the Fairfax Family;
