Competition entry numbers for our 46 sections from beef cattle to cakes have now returned to pre-pandemic levels, with about 21,000 entries received.

This year marks the 144th Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) presented by RACQ, bringing the country and city together in a true celebration of agriculture.

Since the first Show in 1876, the Ekka has championed Queensland's agriculture and industry and the vital role they play in our everyday lives and community.

The Show made its historic return in 2022 following two years of cancellations, with more than 345,000 people coming through the gates.

Competition entry numbers for our 46 sections from beef cattle to cakes have now returned to pre-pandemic levels, with about 21,000 entries received.

Our competitions, some of which have taken place for more than 100 years, are the heart and soul of the Show.

We are thrilled to recognise and reward our exhibitors, who year in year out, produce the best of the best, with many in rural areas battling drought and floods to do so.

The Ekka has also continued to support and educate the next generation of Queenslanders through a revamped education program this year.

An education stage has been introduced for the 2023 Show, in

addition to the interactive agricultural learning experiences the state's largest classroom already offers.

The stage will feature educational presentations for children, from learning about healthy and nutritious food to pollination and gardening.

The RNA has been mindful of rising cost of living pressures and providing families with value for money so Ekka can be enjoyed on any budget.

Rides are a major attraction at the Ekka and for the first time in the Show's history, visitors will be able to enjoy two for one rides every morning of Show from 9am to 10.30am.

The Ekka is also once again offering four special Super Saver Days of Show - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday - with entry prices 20 per cent cheaper than weekends and the public holiday.

The RNA sincerely appreciates your support of the Show and we look forward to welcoming you to this year's Ekka.

REMEMBERING EKKA LEGEND KEVIN HICKEY



The RNA expressed great sadness at the passing of Mr Kevin Hickey, our 2013 Ekka Legend, in June.

Kevin attended his first Ekka at age two in 1933 and showed stud dairy cattle -Friesians and Ayrshires - every year for more than 60 years.

Hailing from the Samford district, Kevin was a third-generation dairy farmer whose grandparents William and Hannah Hickey started showing dairy cattle at the Ekka in 1926.

The Hickey family has shown at every Ekka since then, resulting in 86 years of continuous showing.

Kevin and his family are an institution of the Queensland dairy cattle industry and have been great supporters of the Show for more than eight decades.

Not only did Kevin have a great passion for showing dairy cattle, but he also tirelessly assisted our organisation with his expertise in the Dairy Section, the Grand Parade, and the milking competitions.

Kevin also very proudly ensured that a fifth generation of Hickeys carried on the traditions and values of exhibiting cattle and championing agriculture for the future.

After his first Show in 1933, he attended every year up until 2019 - a remarkable 86 years of continuous support and service to the show movement.

In 2013, Kevin was awarded the RNA's highest honour – the Ekka Legend Award.

It is bestowed on those who have made an extraordinary contribution to the Show.

The award was first introduced in 2004 and just 15 people have been awarded this prestigious honour.

It is due to the inspiring dedication of people like Kevin who have selflessly given thousands of hours of their time, that has helped make the Ekka the most beloved event in the State.

We are forever grateful for Kevin's lifelong commitment and dedication to the Ekka and join with the Ekka family in appreciating his remarkable Show legacy.

She also served two terms as President of Queensland Ag Shows in 2021 and 2022.

TO THE EKKA

Due to the construction of Cross River Rail, Exhibition Station won't be operating during Ekka in 2023.

You'll still be able to catch a ride to the Ekka with public transport options including trains and buses from nearby stops and stations.

Cross River Rail is transforming Exhibition Station into a new, fully accessible station, that will provide year-round services for the growing suburb of Bowen Hills, Herston Quarter and the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital.

TOP TIPS FOR GETTING TO SHOW

 Catch the Ekka shuttle (route EK1, stopping at all stations between Woolloongabba and Herston busway stations) or a high-frequency bus to Herston busway station. Once at Herston, your day at the Ekka will begin with entertainment featured along a 550-metre walk (7-minutes) to the Show gates.

- Travelling by train? Catch a train to Fortitude Valley station and follow the Ekka signs to the show gates, which is only a 550-metre walk (7-minutes).
- Accessible transfers will be available for customers with accessibility needs from Herston busway station and Fortitude Valley station.

WHAT'S NEW COMPETITIONS

Following an unprecedented and challenging few years, competition entry numbers for our 46 sections have now returned to pre-pandemic levels, with 21,000 entries received.

Entry numbers for some of our major competitions have even surpassed 2019 levels.

Canine numbers have increased by 10 per cent with more than 2,470 entries; Poultry has increased to 1,926 entries, up by 10 per cent; and Woodchop & Sawing has jumped to 1,970 entries, an increase of 38 per cent.

Meanwhile, Farriers and Blacksmiths has climbed to 383 entries, an increase of 54 per cent; Cookery has increased by 22 per cent to 1,148 entries; and Showjumping has increased by 12 per cent to 554 entries.

It has also been fantastic to see Ekka's next generation thriving. We have young people pursuing some of the Show's oldest competitions from cookery to cake decorating, quilt making, blacksmithing, and woodchopping. Our youngest quilter is just four years old!

New competition classes and themes this year include:

- Apiculture: new Junior Beekeeper Liquid Honey class
- Cake Decorating: new class celebrating the 60th anniversary of the iconic Bertie Beetle chocolate

Cookery: New Future Directions feature class theme - Bertie

- feature class theme Bertie Beetle. New ABC Radio Brisbane Queensland On a Plate class featuring the pineapple upside down cake. Plus new classes for brownies and chocolate chip biscuits
- Natural Fibres Make & Model and Wearable Art Competition: New 1970's fashion era and steam punk themes, plus a new Adults in Wool class
- Painting and Drawing: Two new youth classes displaying artworks from those aged 12 and under, plus 13-18 year olds
- Stud Beef: the feature breed this year is Limousin. First time in the competition's history an international judge has featured - PJ Budler from the USA
- Prime Beef: new Single Heifer classes
- Canine Competition presented by Sushi Hub: new RNA Scent Work Trials class
- Dairy Cattle: an extra \$10,000 in prize money on offer, taking the total to \$32,000. Also a new location this year, with cattle displayed on Level 1 of the Large Animal Pavilion and judging taking place on the Main Arena
- Education on Show: new theme -Learning: A Lifelong Experience

- Sheep: inclusion of Corriedale and Dorset Down breeds
- Floristry: new class called Arrangement for a Bar
- Horse: two new children's competition classes - Child's Show Pony Galloway & Hack and Child's Show Hunter Galloway & Hack. Plus a new class called Senior and Junior
- Showjumping: new Queensland Off-The-Track Program Showcase, offering \$50,000 in prize money
- Poultry, Pigeons, Birds and Eggs: two new school classes in the egg section
 Primary (Prep to Grade 6) and Senior (Grades 7-12)
- Quilts Across Queensland presented by Pillow Talk: two new classes -Abstract Art and Pictorial Art Quilt
- Woodchop and Sawing presented by AAM: increased prize pool worth more than \$145,000, up 45 per cent on 2022. Four new Australian Title events – 325mm Australian Women's Single Sawing Championship, 375mm Australian Jack & Jill Double Handed Sawing Championship, 275mm Australian Women's Underhand Championship, and 450mm Australian Double Handed Sawing Championship

EKKA'S FARMYARD FRIENDS STREET PARADE

NEW HOME For show camp

After more than 70 years in its previous location, Show Camp has been relocated to the Large Animal Pavilion offering more than twice the amount of work space.

Show campers will live in the roof-top residential village, with a classroom on a lower level.

Show Camp Honorary Council Steward Keith Enchelmaier said the new location will place show campers in the centre of the Ekka action.

"They will see the activities of Beef Week at close hand and will be much closer to some feature locations like the Main Arena, Ag Education Hall, Woodchop Arena and Sideshow Alley," he said.

"The classroom overlooks the Main Arena, so students will be able to see what is happening there while they are working." The campers are selected from year six Queensland State School students who have completed an online news writing course.

Their Ekka experiences will provide opportunities for them to further develop their news writing skills.

The students research and write news stories about the activities of the Ekka. Their stories are published in The Ekka Courier, the Show Camp newspaper that has been published since 1992.

Show Camp has evolved from a residential program, which commenced in 1928. Country boys were brought to the Show to learn more about keeping and showing farm animals.

The first camp was a combined project of the RNA and the then Departments of Pub-

lic Instruction and Agriculture and Stock.

The camp is now a partnership between the RNA and the Queensland Department of Education.

Show Camp has been housed in several locations at the Ekka over the years.

In 1935, a dormitory was built behind the John Reid Pavilion to provide accommodation for the Farm Boys and Rural Youth members visiting the Show.

In 1948, the building was relocated to a site beside Exhibition Street behind the old Poultry Pavilion.

During the 1980s, renovations were made to provide two dormitory spaces so the girls who attended the camp could also stay on site. Girls had previously stayed in a hostel in Gregory Terrace.

ROYAL QUEENSLAND AWARDS WRAPUP

The RNA's prestigious Royal Queensland Awards presented by King Street enjoyed a successful year, attracting more than 2,600 entries across its six competitions - Branded Beef; Branded Lamb; Cheese and Dairy; Ice Cream, Gelato and Sorbet; Wine; and Beer.

This was an increase of almost 10 per cent compared to 2022.

It was fierce competition in this year's Royal Queensland Beer Awards, with a record 663 beers entered, an increase of more than 15 per cent compared to last year.

Meanwhile entries in the Branded Beef and

Lamb competitions were up 35 per cent (72 entries) on last year and entries in the dairy competitions rose by 20 per cent (441 entries).

The Royal Queensland Wine Awards attracted 1,428 entries this year, on par with 2022.
