Welcome

he Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) presented by RACQ is all about celebrating and championing agriculture and the critical role it plays in our everyday lives.

Last year, more than 415,000 people attended the Ekka, with many showing their support for our farmers who continue to battle the devastating drought.

The RNA is committed to helping our farming families, many of whom have exhibited at the Ekka for countless generations, since the first show in 1876.

To ensure Queenslanders can again show their support and appreciation for the people that feed and clothe us each day, we have frozen the price of every ticket for the first time in 11 years (the Little Ekka Pass for children four years of age and under is free).

Our competitions are the heart and soul of the Ekka and with more than 21,000 entries received this year, we encourage visitors to look at what our exhibitors are contributing to Queensland - whether it's beef or dairy cattle, fleece or even giant vegetables.

The RNA is also continuing to invest in competition facilities, ensuring the next generation of exhibitors and visitors can enjoy a better experience.

The new Alexandria Park, which is part of the \$2.9 billion Brisbane Showgrounds Regeneration Project, will be home to Ekka's Championship Canine Competition presented by Black Hawk.



The park features two acres of additional green and event space, allowing entrants to exhibit their dogs on grass.

It's also the very first time all four storeys of the Arrow Energy Pavilion will be used to house animals at the Ekka.

Two floors were used last year housing beef and dairy cattle, dairy goats and poultry, but with all four now ready, sheep, angoras and alpacas will also use our world-class facility.

For visitors, it means another two football fields of space where they can see animals at the show and meet our farmers.

Our visitors will also see a tribute to our farmers during the world-class night show EkkaNITES supported by RACQ LifeFlight Rescue.

The theme of the Fireworks Spectacular this year is 'A Celebration of the Human Spirit,' recognising the remarkable resilience and determination of our primary producers.

Everything starts with agriculture from the food we eat to the clothes we wear and the RNA is proud to run Queensland's largest event and agricultural show on behalf of the community each year.

We hope you enjoy the 2019 Royal Queensland Show.

Our guide to what's new this year at Queensland's largest and most loved annual event, the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka).

Queenslanders are being urged to show their support for farming families battling drought and the devastation of the February floods, by attending the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) in August.

The Ekka runs from the 9th to 18th, with the RNA freezing ticket prices for the first time in 11 years to encourage people to attend and show their support for farmers.

RNA Chief Executive Brendan Christou said the Ekka had been bringing the country to the city since 1876 to celebrate and showcase agriculture and its importance to the community.

"Queensland is now in its seventh year of drought with 65.2 per cent of the state drought declared in May, while the February floods in North Queensland resulted in catastrophic losses for many primary producers," he said.

"Our farmers are the backbone of our nation and the RNA wants to draw attention to the many challenges they are facing, as well as provide opportunities for them to engage with others in the broader Queensland community and enjoy some much needed respite.

"The Ekka showcases the extraordinary resilience of our farmers and rural communities, and also recognises and rewards our exhibitors, who year in year

out, produce the best of the best despite the crippling impacts of drought and flood."

More than 400,000 people are expected to flock to this year's Ekka which will showcase about 21,000 competition entries and 10,000 animals.

SUPER SAVINGS!

The RNA has this year frozen the price of all seven paid passes (the Little Ekka Pass for children four years and under is free).

This means the popular Family Pass for two adults and two children, which last year was the cheapest Family Pass in 15 years, remains at just \$80.

Tickets are even cheaper if families sign up to the *Ekka newsletter* online, with more discounts on offer through promotional codes.

Adding to the great value on offer in 2019 are the three super saver passes, including the new Super Seniors Day on Thursday 15 August.

Seniors will get a 10 per cent discount on their \$25 pass online, plus there is increased seniors entertainment including performances by famous singers Normie Rowe and Jackie Love.

Meanwhile the Super Ride Tuesday and Super Food Sunday 2 for 1 days are back for the fourth year, which also include a 10 per cent online ticket discount.

Families can purchase 2 for 1 rides on Tuesday 13 August and 2 for 1 food items on Sunday 18 August.

For the first time on Super Ride Tuesday, families can also enjoy increased children's entertainment including a Dora the Explorer live stage show.

EKKA APP

Visitors can download the Ekka app to plan their perfect day at show and pick their favourite showbags. Once at the show, the app can be used to easily navigate around the grounds, activate augmented reality content and receive special offers. New additions to the app this year are itineraries including from local celebrities and improved wayfinding including inside buildings.

ALEXANDRIA PARK

The Ekka's Championship Canine Competition presented by Black Hawk has a brand new home this year.

The competition will be held in the new Alexandria Park on the corner of Gregory Terrace and Alexandria Street.

The park features two acres of additional green and event space, including an existing undercover events pavilion known as Building 8.

The building has undergone extensive refurbishment works to enhance its heritage elements and will be used for competition benching, providing exhibitors with one central benching area.

Meanwhile the canine judging ring will be located in a custom marquee on the grass, allowing entrants to exhibit their dogs on real turf with improved direct access to the judging rings.

The park will also offer greatly improved

lighting, power, ambience and better facilities and access for public viewing.

Alexandria Park was completed in late April and is part of the \$2.9 billion Brisbane Showgrounds Regeneration Project, providing exhibitors and patrons with worldclass facilities to use.

Outside of Ekka, Alexandria Park will be used as an event space and can also be enjoyed by the public.

RACQ ANIMAL NURSERY

The Ekka's most popular daytime attraction, the RACQ Animal Nursery, will be bigger and better than ever with a brand new

The nursery will have a bigger location in Expo Place this year, next door to the popular Kids Carnival area and adjacent to Alexandria Park.

The kids will love getting up close to hundreds of farmyard animals on their adventure through the nursery, as they pat and feed pigs, lambs, goats, chickens, ducklings and more.

ARROW ENERGY PAVILION

For the very first time, all four storeys of the Arrow Energy Pavilion will be used to house animals at the Ekka.

The pavilion, which debuted at last year's show, will feature animals on all four levels including beef and dairy cattle, poultry, dairy goats, sheep, angoras and alpacas.

With only two floors complete last year, that's another two football fields of space where visitors can see animals at the show.

The Arrow Energy Pavilion is the only building of its kind in the world and has been specially designed to house animals during Ekka.

Outside of show, it's used as an events space and car park facility - with all revenue invested back into the Ekka.



This year we are proud to announce that proceeds from feed at the RACQ Animal Nursery will be donated directly to the RACQ Foundation to help Queenslanders get back on their feet during tough times.



Where & When: Fashion Stage at 11.30am, 12.30pm, 1.30pm & 2.30pm daily. Also at 3.30pm on August 14

The Nature in Bloom Natural Fibres Fashion Parades presented by Channel Seven will celebrate Queensland agriculture and community, with a new line-up of women's and menswear designers in 41 shows over the 10 days of Ekka.

The parades, directed by Laura Churchill for the third year, will celebrate the colours and climate of spring in Queensland in a new Nature in Bloom show.

Inspired by the iconic Queensland scene of jacarandas in flower, Nature in Bloom will provide a romantic, floral backdrop to showcase Queensland's best natural fibre fashion.

In a new dimension to the show, awardwinning violinist Emma Beau will open and close each parade with a live violin performance, setting the romantic theme.

Returning this year will be the daily Meet the Models sessions, plus the student design segment and Fibre to Fashion Conversation Series.

Closing the parade will be a couture gown designed by international costume designer Kirsten Fletcher of 'Alice in Wonderland'

and 'Beauty and the Beast' fame.

This year marks the 28th year of Ekka presenting its fashion parades, which is the show's most glamorous event.

To continue the Ekka tradition of championing local talent, there is a fresh line-up of 16 Queensland designers - seven of which are new to the Ekka runway.

EKKA PINBALL ARCADE

For the first time in its 142 year history, the Ekka will host two of the largest pinball and arcade competitions in the southern hemisphere - the Brisbane Pinball Masters and the Australian Kong Off 3.

In a joint venture with Brisbane's blossoming micro cosmos of arcade bars and pinball halls, the Ekka will be home to a pinball and games arcade featuring 50 pinball machines and 20 original arcade games for the 10 days of show, culminating with the Brisbane Pinball Masters on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 August.

Players will also have the opportunity to set world record arcade attempts, attend arcade and pinball masterclasses, as

well as compete in the highly anticipated Australian Kong Off 3.

The Ekka Pinball Arcade is open to all guests and aspiring pinball wizards from 9am to 10.30pm each day of show.


LUKE'S REPTILE KINGDOM **VENOMOUS SNAKE SHOW**

AGRICULTURAL HALL PRESENTED BY SEQWATER

The Ekka is Queensland's largest classroom, with more than 30,000 children inspired, educated and entertained each year over the 10 days of show.

The Agricultural Hall presented by Seqwater features an amazing array of educational activities, delightful experiences and hands-on learning for children, with a special focus on innovation and sustainability in 2019.

Children will enjoy learning how agriculture impacts every area of our lives, with the Agricultural Hall presented by Segwater showcasing rural life and agricultural innovations, explaining where healthy and nutritious food comes from and providing opportunities to meet farmers and primary producers.

FIELD TO FORK

The best place to start in food education is to take kids to the very beginning and teach them about agriculture and how their food travels from the field to their fork.

All stages of the agricultural cycle are covered, from composting, growing and planting, to harvesting and processing.

Kids will have a chance to roll up their sleeves and enjoy the following activities, which will run from 9am to 6pm:

- Composting composting is nature's way of recycling! This activity highlights the difference between biodegradable and non-biodegradable, the importance of decomposition and how compost is made and why it's important for soil health. Kids will learn methods for at-home composting.
- Growing and Planting identifying and planting seeds and seed pods is always a favourite kids gardening

activity. Here kids will learn how to identify different types of fruit and vegetables and have the opportunity to guess the plant.

- Harvesting when a crop has grown and is ready to eat, the farmer must collect or harvest it from the fields. Kids will enjoy learning about the many different harvesting processes, such as picking fruits by hand or collecting wheat with combine harvesters.
- Processing how does wheat become a loaf of bread? Kids will enjoy learning about the grain to flour process through the Grain Chain. This display will teach the kids what's involved in processing and milling grains into consumable products which they can find on supermarket shelves.
- Cooking kids LOVE cooking... it's fun, messy and a powerful learning experience for children. Kids will be inspired as they learn to make a healthy and yummy corn and vegetable fritter at the Kids get cracking, get cooking with Australian Eggs.

SEQWATER

When: 9am to 6pm


Seqwater will create an exciting and inspiring space for kids to understand, appreciate and connect with water.

Their stand will feature the new 'Sippidy doo Bar' where Ekka goers will be able to quench their thirst with drinks made from desalinated water such as 'Iced Teasal' and 'Saltless Sparking Seawater.'

Their popular giant augmented reality sandpit will return this year, educating kids with a simulation of what a drought would look like across south east Queensland.

The Segwater stand would also not be complete without its water refill station for people to fill up their water bottles.

Lockyer Valley farming group benefits from Woolworths Organic **Growth Fund**



Australian Organic Farmers in the Lockyer Valley are the first Queensland beneficiaries of the Woolworths Organic Growth Fund.

LITTLE BACKYARD **FARMERS**

Little Backyard Farmers is a brand new and interactive educational activity, teaching kids about urban farming.

There are six hands-on stations where children are taught the importance of future sustainability practices through composting, planting seeds, growing vegetables and nurturing plants.

With a basket in hand, children will collect produce at the stations, before sorting the items into compost, recycle or waste tubs.

- 1. CHICKEN COOP kids will enter a large coop, searching for an egg to add to their basket among the chickens (props) and hay. They'll learn about life cycles and raising hens.
- 2. FLOWERS AND BEES in this colour matching activity, children will wear a pair of coloured cellophane sunglasses and weave their way through a giant flower garden to collect pollen. They'll put their pollen disc into the beehive, before moving

to the next station.

3. VEGGIE PATCH: PLANTING children will dig in a garden bed, planting vegetable seeds. They'll also learn about the importance of worm activity in the garden.

4. VEGGIE PATCH: HARVESTING

- children will harvest vegetables to learn about garden care and growth. They'll find out how long different fruits and vegetables take to grow and will add some lettuce, potatoes and carrots to their basket.
- 5. FRUIT ORCHARD children will water apple and orange trees (props) and pick a fruit for their basket. They'll also have to identify whether certain fruits and vegetables are in fact a fruit or a vegetable.
- 6. COMPOST AND RECYCLE using their basket of produce and other items, children will learn what to compost and what to recycle. They'll sort the items into compost, recycle or waste tubs.

At the end of the activity, the kids will receive a seedling to take home and plant, to start their backyard farming journey.

BROOKFIELD GARDENS 'THE JUNGLE ROOM' BY **CLAIRE BICKLE**

For the first time at Ekka, Brookfield Gardens by Claire Bickle will showcase 'The Jungle Room,' an interactive plant display inspiring the immersion of nature and indoors.

This green spectacle will be made of seasonal produce, and hanging and indoor plants intertwined across everyday household furniture, teaching people about the remedial effects of plants in everyday life.

The designer, Claire Bickle, has been a qualified horticulturist for more than two decades, raising awareness of both the physical and mental benefits of bringing the outdoors indoors.

Those wanting to try out their green thumbs and bring nature into their homes can visit the Brookfield Gardens pop-up shop at the end of the exhibit.

The Star Flyer in Kids Carnival will take children 30 metres into the air.



Hat-trick of best steak titles for Darling Downs wagyu

Stockyard's Wagyu Kiwami has won the battle of the beef for the third year in a row, taking out the title of Australia's best steak at the Royal Queensland Food and Wine Show (RQFWS) Branded Beef and Lamb Competition Awards at the Brisbane Showgrounds in May.

The premium wagyu brand, produced at Jondaryan on the Darling Downs, steaked the coveted John Kilroy Cha Cha Char Grand Champion Branded Beef of Show trophy over 49 other entrants.

The Darling Downs also stood out in the hunt for Australia's best lamb, with Queensland raised lamb winning a medal for the first time in the competition's 10 year history.

Karbullah at Goondiwindi claimed a bronze medal in the Restaurant Trade Branded Lamb class for their lamb entry fed on saltbush.

A record 73 entries were received in the Branded Beef and Lamb Competition this year - an increase of more than 20 per cent on last year.

NSW gelato pips Queensland to scoop title of Australia's best ice cream

A chocolate gelato from New South Wales has melted Queensland's four year winning streak to be named Australia's best, at the Royal Queensland Food and Wine Show's (RQFWS) Ice Cream, Gelato and Sorbet Competition Awards presented by King Street at the Brisbane Showgrounds in

May.

The Cioccolato Arancia (chocolate gelato with a hint of orange) produced by Gelato & Co at Murwillumbah, beat 151 other entrants to claim the King Street Grand Champion Ice Cream, Gelato or Sorbet of Show trophy.

Queensland producers had won the title four years in a row.

Meanwhile Victoria's Berrys Creek Gourmet Cheese also saw their four year winning streak come to an end, with the title of Australia's best cheese in the Cheese and Dairy Produce Show presented by King Street awarded to Tasmania's Lion Dairy and Drinks for their Heidi Farm Raclette.

Berrys Creek had been taking out the title with their blue cheeses, but this year their Riverine Blue which won a gold medal, was just outshone by the raclette, known as a melting cheese.

A total of 547 entries were received this year - an increase of more than 20 per cent on last year and the highest they've been in three years.

Pinot Noir crowned Australia's best

A Pinot Noir from Tasmania has broken a six year winning streak by white wine varieties, to be crowned Australia's best at the Royal Queensland Wine Show (RQWS) Awards at the Brisbane Showgrounds in

The Giant Steps Nocton Vineyard Pinot Noir 2018 is the first red wine to claim the Angelo Puglisi Grand Champion Wine of Show since 2013, with the award usually

dominated by Chardonnay.

The top drop also won the prestigious Stodart Trophy for the best red table wine of show.

Yarra Valley winemakers and red wine varieties continued their success, with the new Chief Judge's Award going to Yarra Yering's Dry Red Wine No.3 2018.

A total of 1,695 wines from 234 Australian wineries were entered in the competition this year, with 4.6 per cent awarded gold medals, speaking highly of the wine being made across the country.
