
The theme of our world-class night Show this year is 'it's time to celebrate', recognising the people of Queensland coming back together again to celebrate our great state.

EKKAFAMILIES

DOUG, REB-EKKA AND CELEBRATING FAMILY TRADITIONS

The Royal Queensland Show is synonymous with 'family'. Most of us have our own stories to tell and Ekka memories as vivid as if they happened yesterday.

The Ekka connection often extends through generations of family members. Stories and secret recipes are shared, showbag guides circled and highlighted, and children and grandchildren 'learn the ropes' of preparing an exhibit or competition entry.

The anticipation of the show each August is different for everyone, young and old, from city and country, but the feeling is real. In recognition and celebration of Ekka family traditions and storytelling, we're going to tell you the story of the Levingston

This story starts with Douglas Levingston, who passed away peacefully at age 95 on what would have been the final day of Ekka 2020 (16 August), if the Show had in fact gone ahead. As his son Brad said in Doug's eulogy..."it was in some ways fitting that the show could not go ahead, given Doug was unable to attend this year".

Doug's association with Ekka was both professional and personal. His parents

Joseph and Annie were regular attendees and RNA Members through the 1920s and 1930s, so Doug was introduced to the Ekka as a young boy. His grandmother Catherine Beverley was a horsewoman who rode for Ernest Baynes in the 1890s.

In the late 1940s Doug joined the Queensland Police Force where he served until the late '70s. Doug spent many hours at the Showgrounds over this time, always volunteering to perform his police duties at Ekka, as well as the RNA Speedway at the

In those days, the more senior policemen



from the bush would be transported to Brisbane to help-out at the Show - a true merging of country and city. Doug would explain that you could always spot the bush coppers as they wore Khaki uniforms and the city police wore their blues, and how it was great to have them there.

Doug could not get enough of the Ekka and as he and wife Evelyn welcomed each of their four children, Doug was eager to share the Ekka with them too.

The Levingston family continued to grow, with eight grandchildren and 12 great grandkids.

One of the grandchildren is well-known Ekka enthusiast and ABC Brisbane radio presenter, Rebecca Levingston.

On 19 August 2005, ABC's then morning presenter, Spencer Howson, captured Rebecca's first trip to the Ekka alongside her grandfather. Doug was 80 years of age at the time and had only missed one show in all these years - in 1941 due to the war.

During this interview, Doug pulled from his jacket pocket silhouettes of each of his children, cut by iconic exhibitor John Ross, who in this year was celebrating his 57th Ekka. Just days after this interview, John Ross was awarded the 2005 Ekka Legend Award by the RNA Council for recognition of his contribution to the Show.

Rebecca fell in love with the Ekka on this day and has been a recognised voice of the show ever since. Like her grandfather, Rebecca is always the first to put her hand up to cover the Ekka; happy to mix work with the show. A true storyteller, Rebecca is looking forward to broadcasting live for ABC radio at Ekka 2022.


