PRESIDENT **FROM** RNA DAVID



We're looking forward to welcoming you to the 149th Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) presented by Bank of Queensland (BOQ) - a nine-day celebration of Queensland's best, running from Saturday 9 to Sunday 17 August.

In 2025, the Show is set to be more budget-conscious than ever, with a strong focus on delivering value offerings that make the Ekka more accessible and affordable for all.

Building on the success of last year's cost-saving initiatives, more than 110 food vendors will once again offer a value menu item priced at \$10 or less. In a first for the Show, the food outlets will also feature family bundles, with meals starting from just \$12 to feed a family of four.

Another exciting addition this year is the option to pre-order the iconic Ekka Strawberry Sundae when purchasing tickets online. A new fourfor-\$25 bundle will allow showgoers to plan ahead and enjoy one of the Show's sweetest traditions at a discounted price.

The popular daily two-for-one rides session is back, offering one hour of discounted rides from 9:30-10:30am in the B105 Sideshow Alley and Kids Carnival areas. Making the rides experience even more seamless this year is the launch of the Ekka Fun Pass App - designed to eliminate the need to visit a ticket booth. The Ekka Fun Pass will also deliver bonus ride credit to give showgoers even more value.

To help visitors get the most out of their Show experience, the RNA has introduced the new Back for More Pass, giving patrons the chance to enjoy a second day at the Ekka for just \$22 - less than the price of a Child ticket.

Transport is more affordable too, with 50-cent fares available, including to the newly upgraded Exhibition Station reopening for this year's Ekka. For the first time since 2022, visitors can arrive and depart by train from inside the Brisbane Showgrounds.

This year's Ekka will also offer a greater focus on interactive, educational experiences that complement our beloved competitions. Visitors can learn more about Queensland's beef industry and meet some of the Show's largest bulls at the new Queensland Beef Up Close presented by Meat & Livestock Australia. They can also discover how goats are cared for and how fresh goat milk is collected at the new Dairy & Kid Experience.

Competitions remain at the heart of the Ekka and in 2025 we're expecting around 21,000 entries across 46 categories. There has been strong growth in several areas, particularly our beef competitions. Entries in Paddock to Palate presented by JBS Australia have increased by 35 per cent, while Stud Beef and Led Steer have each grown by more than 10 per cent.

Our Poultry, Pigeons, Birds and Eggs Competition has seen a 50 per cent increase in egg entries, and the Art and Cookery Competitions are thriving with more than 4,700 entries submitted. Interest in Wearable Art and Natural Fibres Make and Model has surged, with a 30 per cent increase in both categories.

Entertainment remains a highlight of the Show and this year is no exception. The EkkaNITES night show returns with a bold new Inferno theme - a fiery tribute to the land, the people and the stories that burn brightly in the heart of Australia's outback.

Since 1876, the Ekka has brought people together to showcase, celebrate and experience the very best of agriculture and Queensland. The RNA sincerely appreciates your support and we hope you enjoy this year's Show.

EXHIBITION STATION IS BACK ON TRACK FOR EKKA 2025

The newly upgraded Exhibition station will reopen for this year's Ekka, welcoming patrons back for the first time since 2022.

With major construction now complete, the station is ready to temporarily open for large-scale events including Queensland's largest, the Ekka.

For the first time in years, Ekka-goers will be able to arrive and depart by train from right inside the Brisbane Showgrounds, with the station located in the heart of the event.

Plus, with 50 cent public transport on the Translink network, getting to the Show has never been cheaper.

The Tilt Train will also stop at Exhibition Station, with half-price Economy Seat fares for both adults and children on select services between Bundaberg and Brisbane.

ALL ABOARD FOR A MILESTONE MOMENT

Queensland Rail is celebrating 160 years of

connecting communities with the return of steam train journeys to the Ekka for the first time since 2019.

On Wednesday 13 August, eight special steam train services will depart from Roma Street Station, offering Queenslanders a nostalgic and family-friendly way to travel to the Show – all for just 50 cents.

Leading the celebrations will be the historic BB18 ¼ steam engine 'Betty.' More information on the celebrations can be found here.





And that's not all. This year, two of our most popular educational activities - Get Kids Cooking! presented by Australian Eggs and Harvest to Home presented by Manildra - have increased their capacity from 30 to 50 children per session, making room for even more young learners to get hands-on with food and farming.

WHAT'S NEW HIGHLIGHTS

STRAWBERRY SUNDAE LANE PRESENTED BY BOQ

Strawberry Sundae Lane presented by Bank of Queensland (BOQ) is an exciting educational activation that brings one of the Show's most iconic treats - the strawberry sundae - to life in an engaging and interactive way.

Behind every scoop lies a story of agriculture, and at Strawberry Sundae Lane you can explore the journey from field to fair. Through hands-on activities, children will discover how strawberries are grown, how milk becomes ice cream, how sugarcane is turned into refined sugar, and how wheat is harvested and turned into crunchy cones.

There are more than 10 interactive learning elements over 16 metres at Strawberry Sundae Lane, plus kids can enjoy a taste of the famous strawberry ice cream and try a juicy, fresh strawberry for themselves. Thanks to the Queensland Strawberry Growers Association who've purchased 30,000 strawberries directly from farmers, with support from Berries Australia and the Department of Primary Industries. Children will also receive a strawberry seed card (while stocks last), thanks to BOQ, so they can grow their own strawberries at home.

WOOL WORKSHOP PRESENTED BY TOY FARM

WHEN: 9.30am, 10.30am, 11.30am, 12.30pm, 1.30pm, 2.30pm, 3.30pm, 4.30pm, 5.30pm daily

Experience the wonders of wool from sheep to yarn at the new Wool Workshop presented by Toy Farm.

Kids will get hands-on as they explore the wool-making journey, from meeting the sheep to spinning wool and weaving.

They'll sort fleece, try carding and spinning, plus learn the basics of weaving on a hand loom.

Children will finish by braiding wool into a colourful bracelet to take home.

CLUCK AND COLLECT

Children are invited to roll up their sleeves and become little farmers in the new Cluck and Collect, a hands-on egg-collecting adventure.

They will reach beneath imitation hens to collect eggs, then sort them for delivery to the market, supermarket or home - learning along the way that eggs don't just magically appear on shelves.

GIANT PINEAPPLE DISPLAY BY NATIONAL PINEAPPLE ASSOCIATION

A beloved Queensland icon is making a comeback at the Ekka with the recreation of the Giant Pineapple - a 3-metrehigh structure built from 200–300 real pineapples!

Led by Chris Doyle, grandson of the original giant pineapple builder, the display celebrates the heritage of Queensland horticulture while drawing attention to the economic challenges and declining consumption facing the pineapple industry.

The display will be complemented by the Tropical Pines food trailer, serving up fresh-cut, juiced and dried pineapple - with around 10 tonnes to be sampled during the Show!



PADDOCK TO PALATE



Queensland beef producers dominated the first phase of the RNA's prestigious Paddock to Palate Competition presented by JBS Australia in Toowoomba in June, delivering standout performances in weight gain.

Russell Pastoral Operations from Blackall, Queensland, led the charge with multiple wins with their Angus X cattle.

They secured first place in Class 37A with an ADG of 2.797kg and also took top honours in Class 40A with an ADG of 2.287kg, along with the highest individual weight gain in that class of 2.87kg.

In Class 38A, Devon Court Herefords from Drillham claimed first place with an ADG of 3.113kg, while a Charolais steer exhibited by Keddstock Pty Ltd from Yuleba topped the individual ADG results at 3.431kg.

The Wagyu Challenge (class 39A) also saw strong Queensland representation, with Thomas Burnett from Dirranbandi taking first place with an ADG of 1.286kg with his Wagyu X Angus.

Hancock Agriculture from Bell secured the

highest individual weight gain for that class with an ADG of 1.613kg with their fullblood Wagyu entry.

Palgrove Pastoral Co from Bukkulla, New South Wales, also made their mark, securing several placings with their Ultrablack, including the highest individual ADG of 3.42kg in Class 37A.

The weight gain phase of the competition showcased a diverse range of high-performing breeds including Charolais X, Hereford, Santa Gertrudis, Shorthorn Santa, and Angus X.

Offering almost \$55,000 in prize money, this year's competition attracted 1,085 head of cattle – an impressive 35 per cent increase on 2024.

RNA Beef Committee Chair Gary Noller said the growth in entries showed how valued the competition was within the beef industry.

"We're seeing more entries year on year because exhibitors are recognising the commercial rewards," he said.

"The competition provides real valida-

tion for both seedstock and commercial producers - it proves their genetics are not only performing in the paddock but are also commercially aligned with market demands.

"One of the great strengths of the competition is its benchmarking power, with the data giving producers the opportunity to identify their point of difference.

"The exhibitors who can strike that balance and perform consistently across all phases of the competition are the ones building more viable operations."

Competition classes 37, 38 and 40 are three phased comprising best aggregate weight gain, carcass and MSA eating quality, while the Wagyu Challenge (class 39) is four phased finishing in a beef taste off judged by some of Queensland's top chefs.

The exhibitors who poll the highest aggregate scores across all phases will be awarded the overall prizes at the Paddock to Palate and Beef Industry Dinner presented by JBS Australia at the Brisbane Showgrounds on Thursday 7 August.

RNA UPDATE



EKKA FELLOWSHIP

As the Ekka prepares to celebrate its 150th anniversary in 2026, the Ekka Fellowship - offered by the State Library of Queensland in partnership with the RNA - continues to shine a light on the rich and remarkable history of Queensland's most iconic event.

Now in its second year, the Fellowship supports original research into the Ekka's people, stories and legacy, drawing on the vast resources of both the John Oxley Library collection and the RNA archives.

From pioneering producers to Show legends and lost exhibits, the Fellowship helps uncover the fascinating, lesser-known stories behind 150 years of tradition.

The 2025 Fellowship recipient, to be announced in September, will receive a stipend of \$20,000, a personal workspace within the Neil Roberts Research Lounge for 12 months and premium access to State Library's extensive collections and library staff expertise.

Facilitated by the highly regarded Marcus Oldham College, the

workshop on Thursday 7 and Friday 8 August in the Royal International Convention Centre is designed to equip participants with practical skills, confidence and meaningful connections to help shape the future of Australian agriculture.

The program is proudly supported by the RNA Foundation, which raised \$50,000 at its annual Long Lunch in May. The funds will support three key initiatives: the leadership workshop, a bursary for a rural student to attend St John's College at the University of Queensland, and support for the Lachlan Hughes Foundation to fund a student to complete their innovative Regenerative Agriculture Program.

RNA COUNCIL UPDATE

Following the Annual General Meeting in April, Junior Vice President (JVP) Angus Adnam retired after 20 years serving on the Council, the last 14 as JVP.

He has been involved in the Ekka for almost 50 years after being appointed as a steward in 1978.

The RNA sincerely thanks Mr Adnam for his outstanding service and dedication.

Don Chandler was nominated by the Council as the new JVP while Ari McCamley was appointed to the executive team filling the vacancy.


